- Combined High Schools Surf Carnival went very well.
- Newcastle Permanent are holding their 3rd Birthday on the 20th November, 2008 – we require volunteers from 11am – 3pm to man the BBQ. Port Macquarie offered to supply the IRB. Support Ski will be required – there are two parking spaces booked through the council for use by the IRB & RWC from 9am. Volunteers are required to be in full uniform when manning the BBQ.
- Coaching Course set down for 6th & 7th December, 2008 – Kevin Neilson & Peter Kirkwood running Level 1 course, price \$140.00 per person. Circular released Friday 14th November 2008.

Director of Lifesaving:

Patrols are reporting no problems on all beaches. If anything arises in the way of problems, I would like to know about them straight away so we can rectify them.

Radio system repeater at Smokey Cape has been serviced today. If South West Rocks and Macksville Scotts Head can test the radio system from their respective beaches on the weekend I will report back to SLS NSW.

Club/Patrol Captains conference was held on Saturday 11 October 2008 in port Macquarie. This was attended by most clubs with presentations by John Restuccia the NSW Director of Lifesaving, Craig Roberts Manager NSW Lifesaving and Chris Parker Lifesaving Officer for SLS NSW. All persons seemed to gain some knowledge of how the Lifesaving Portfolio is being managed and what clubs are expected to do as far as compliance goes.

By now, all clubs should have had their gear inspections completed. If they have not been done, please contact your Club Supervisor and have them done ASAP. I need the forms back to me by the end of the month.

I attended the NSW SLS AGM on the weekend with Dennis O'Sullivan and Rod McDonagh. At the conclusion of the AGM, a Lifesaving Forum was held about getting back to the basics and what is our "Core Responsibilities" as Surf Lifesavers. General discussion was held about the Pride Campaign that NSW SLS is running with a series of posters being sent to clubs to be displayed in prominent position, for members to access. This was followed by a brainstorming exercise and three topics chosen for discussion.

These being

- Threats to Surf Lifesaving
- Core Responsibilities
- How we can improve our image

Threats discussed were Councils, APOLA Lifeguards, Lack of Funding, Sponsorship being withdrawn due to the down turn in the economy etc

Core Responsibilities – Patrols, LSA, Beach Management Strategies, Consistency across the state, doing what we say we are going to do.

How we can improve our image – Standard Uniform and wearing it, patrolling smarter not longer, expanding our service outside the flags, offering a better service to our stakeholders and recognising them for what they are.

An RWC examination has been set down for 29 November 2008 at Port Macquarie. All candidates have been made aware of this.

And on the RWC, we have been successful with an application for the RWC in the Yamaha Grant so far. I am in the process of finalising the actual details, but hope to have them by the next meeting.

I have two quotes for the reverse to be put onto the RWC that we currently own and operate. This will enable the operators to utilise the machine with a greater degree of safety and make patients more easily accessible. The money for this to go ahead was raised at the Baseball Canteen held in October. I would like to propose a motion that the RWC have a reverse kit attached to it by Port Macquarie Seadoo as per the attached quotation.

 - All clubs need to make sure that Junior awards – Surf Safe, Surf Awareness, etc for relevant age group are awarded to all nippers prior to 31.12.08 – if this is not completed, then nippers will be ineligible to compete at country, state, etc.
 - Lifesaving Exchange Program for Patrol Captains – this is being set up this season that country –v- city patrol captains are exchanged between 23 – 26th January 2009 – to be eligible they will need to apply to branch once the circular is released. This is for Patrol Captains only this year – in future years will be extended to other members.
 - Junior Lifesaver 17 – 19 February, 2009
 - Youth Opportunity Makers (15-17 years) 20 – 23rd April, 2009
 - 18-25 Leadership Program – 15 – 17th May, 2009.
 - OH & S Safety Officer – have called for identification of 4 Branch Safety Officers – The person will be fully briefed and provided with support to assist in the process of rolling out these resources to clubs. Therefore clubs need to start considering whom is their safety officer.
