DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION REPORT

This year has again seen our Mid North Coast training team continue to excel. Their expertise and professionalism in assisting when asked never ceases to amaze me. A wholehearted and sincere thank you from myself and the Branch Executive.

Again we have had to deal with a number of hardships in the area, including floods and Covid. This has seen a downturn in the amount of awards being processed. It is now more important than ever to continue to provide this valuable training to our members and create new lifesavers on our beaches. Hopefully, in the not too distant future, we may come out the other side of the pandemic and get back to some normality.

Even though we have seen a downturn in awards being processed, we have to deal with change as well. The new HLTAID units of competency has had to force our Trainers, Assessors and Facilitators (TAFs) to requalify to these new units to be able to continue to train the Bronze Medallion. The old UOC was the HLTAID003 and all TAFs needed to upgrade to HLTAID011. This is required to obtain and hold the ARTC award into the future as well. Please note that this is mandatory and must be completed ASAP.

The training officer course has seen a number of members take the opportunity to throw their hats in the ring and become probationary training officers. This will assist clubs in providing that grass roots training that they all require.

Funding has been sort by SLSNSW to upgrade our trainers to become assessors and facilitators. Pre-planning has commenced for this and will be rolled out in the not too distant future. This will again increase our capability as a number of people have been hesitant to upgrade over the last few years.

In the lead up to the end of the financial year a number of first aid courses were conducted, but a lot more need to be completed. We will be pushing this in the new patrol season.

Congratulations to Brienna Elford who was named the Training Officer of the Year. Paul Stiff has also been nominated to represent MNC in the Assessor Category along with Brienna at the NSW AOE. Good luck to those two members.

Surf Life Saving Australia has been directed as a result of a Coronial Inquest to look at the training that is provided to our patrol captains when dealing with incidents. As a result, the old Silver Medallion Beach Management Course has been scrapped due to it no longer fulfilling the requirements of the report from the Coroner. Surf Life Saving Australia has been working with the State bodies and has devised a new Silver Medallion Patrol Captains course. This has been rolled out as a pilot course and we were lucky enough to have two facilitators undertake the training and will be assisting the rollout. How we roll this new course out is yet to be determined, however it is a major priority for the organisation. Silver Medallion Advanced First Aid can no longer be delivered as a Surf Life Saving Award, however, is still available to be conducted through the Australian Lifesaving Academy.

There is to be an ALBERT course to be conducted in November 2022 within the MNC Branch. The venue has yet to be determined.

The MNC Director of Lifesaving is in talks with the ALBERT team for a date and location.

Thanks you to everyone that has assisted me this year. It has been appreciated and I am looking forward to continuing this into the future.

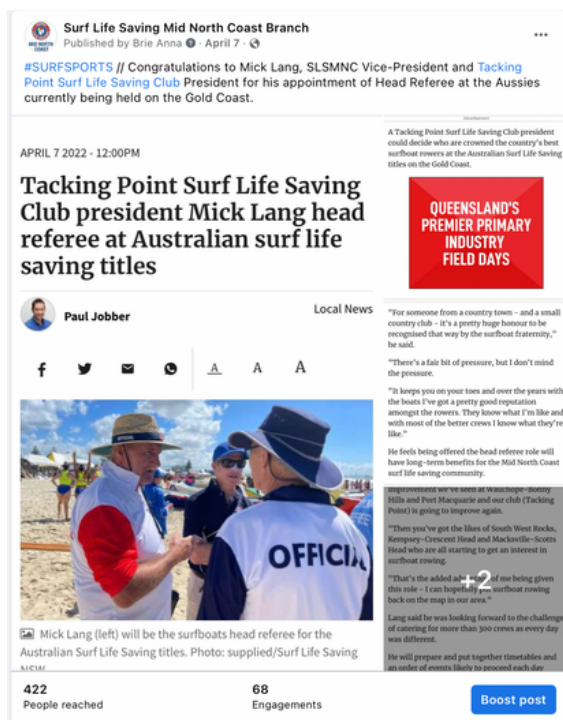

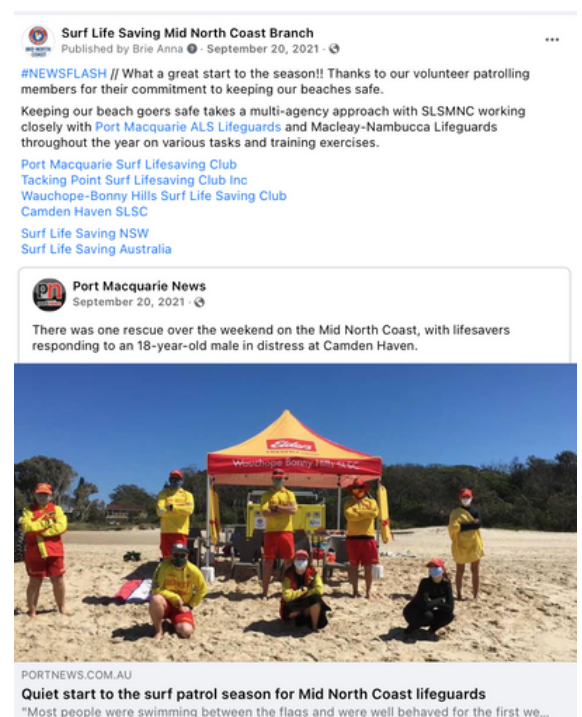

REGISTRAR REPORT

Once again, the Branch clubs were faced with Covid related training issues and storms and flooding affecting training, proficiencies and assessments. Having stated this the members worked hard and adapted to conditions to complete courses and proficiencies to a high level across the Branch. I would like to congratulate all those members who remained steadfast in their roles and achieved great results across the clubs to retain members and train them where and when required. Due to this, proficiencies were down on last season by 300 with a total of 2367 Junior and Senior proficiencies gained.



Surprisingly, an increased number (300) of senior awards, senior proficiencies, JAC awards and proficiencies were carried out or completed totalling 5346. There were 44 new Bronze Medallion awards in the season (down from last year by almost half) which were carried out using modified procedures due to Covid. Unfortunately, there has been a large decrease in the number of senior awards completed such as IRB Crew person award (18) down from (29), Silver Medallion IRB Drivers awards (4) down from (13) which are critical for the successful operation of patrols. Junior Surf Education awards were slightly down in numbers with a little over 600 awards handed out throughout the year.

There were two thousand three hundred and sixty-seven (2367) proficiencies throughout the year with the use of delegates as well as assessors seeming to make the process easier for all. However, a figure lower than last year by 300. Again, reduced numbers across the board and Covid, storms and closed beaches can account for some of this reduction. There is a total of 80 endorsed delegate awards for both trainer and assessor which helped to reduce the workload on assessors and allowed clubs to hold assessment days where and when required. During the season two hundred and eighty-three (283) transfers were completed by Branch clubs during the season. This was up by 30 from last year. Of these, there were 154 transfers in (83 male and 71 female) to the Branch and 129 out (78 male and 51 female).

Retention rates of both Active and Junior members have been an ongoing issue over the last two years and unfortunately, our Branch clubs have suffered this same fate. Having said that the efforts of clubs to retain and attract members should be congratulated as the Branch figures are quite good compared to some of the others. Junior memberships were 877 this year compared to 936 last year. Senior memberships of Active members have fallen, 646 members last year compared to 585 members this year.

I am pleased to report that the club had another strong season although we continued to face challenges due to COVID-19, as highlighted below:

PATROLS

Congratulations to all patrolling members who assisted with patrols. We achieved zero preventable drownings on our beach during patrols and with over 29,000 visitors. This season with approx. 170 active patrolling members plus Active Reserves, this provided sufficient coverage of Flynn's Beach throughout the season which was unfortunately impacted by COVID 19.

Whilst good numbers were available for patrols, IRB Drivers & Crew shortages continue to be an issue especially when subs were required. The acquisition of an ATV and new IRB motors has enhanced the effectiveness of our patrols.

RESCUES

Whilst it's pleasing to report that no fatalities occurred during the season, on a number of occasions this was only due to the vigilance and quick response of our patrolling members. Challenging conditions were faced many times, due to heavy swells and unfavourable beach formations, leading to several intense rescues which would have resulted in drownings or serious injuries without intervention.

Patrolling members carried out over 5000 hours on the beach, reported 1785 preventative actions, and carried out 24 successful rescues - twice as many as last year!

First aid cases consisting of blue bottle stings totalled 12, down on last year when it was 60 plus. Attendance at the beach was slightly 29,000, down from 35,000 the previous season.

AWARDS

The club ran a number of courses throughout the season including Bronze Medallion which bolstered patrol numbers upon completion.

NIPPERS

The season saw a very strong contingent of nippers attend the beach with a high percentage entering competition. The junior club enjoyed a very successful season not only taking out the branch title but also greatly contributing to the club's overall 3rd place at the country titles.

The Junior Committee are to be congratulated on their efforts and are looking forward to another strong season with some new faces in key roles.

SURF SPORTS

The club placed 3rd overall at the Country Championships, largely on the back of a very good showing by the junior club together with a number of successful results for our Masters. As a result of the positive team attitude and willingness from club members to help out, we were able to achieve some outstanding results.

This year's State titles conditions were extremely challenging and due to the extreme rain and flooding event - many events were not completed or cancelled completely. It has been a tough season – in some aspects – but our club has again shown its true colours. Where and when required we all pulled together to ensure that each member/supporter had the opportunity to shine, complete courses, compete in competitions, learn new skills, patrol or simply support the surf lifesaving movement.

LIFESAVING

Continual rain throughout the season led to flooding, runoff, debris in the water and overflows from the sewerage treatment plant. It often felt like the beach was closed more than it was open. We were again on standby to assist with flood evacuations. Pollution, predominantly caused by overflow from the sewerage treatment plant saw the beach closed for 58.5 hours, with dangerous surf conditions accounting for 35.5 hours. Covid impacted our patrols with members, and those in their households, unable to attend due to isolation rules. Our members patrolled for a combined 3813 hours this season, performed 8 rescues, attended to 12 first aid incidents, one requiring an ambulance and conducted 1000 preventative actions.

Jeremy Bates ensured the smooth running of our IRB's and ATV and coordinated our IRB's during flood evacuation.

EDUCATION

While it was a bit of a topsy turvy season in some aspects, what this season again showed was that WBHSLSC has a very solid team of committed and highly skilled patrolling members. The club also have members who realise the advantages and personal experiences and gains that flow from completing further awards within the surf club.

The training team would like to acknowledge the many members who upskilled their awards during the season – the patrolling member is the backbone of the club and by gaining awards the member is helping keep our beaches safe while also gaining nationally accredited awards. 

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MAY 2022

1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporations Act 2009 and the ACNC Act 2012 New South Wales. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

No Australian Accounting Standards, Australian Accounting Interpretations Views or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been intentionally applied.

The following material accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this report:

(a) Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value as indicated less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Plant and Equipment

Plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis and are therefore carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. In the event the carrying amount of plant and equipment is greater than its estimated recoverable amount, the carrying amount is written down immediately to its estimated recoverable amount and impairment losses recognised either in profit or loss or as a revaluation decrease if the impairment losses relate to a revalued asset. A formal assessment of recoverable amount is made when impairment indicators are present.

(b) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

Cash flows are presented on a gross basis. The GST component of cash flows arising from investing or financing activities which are recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO are presented as operating cash flows included in receipts from customers or payments to suppliers.

At the date of this report there are reasonable grounds to believe that the organisation will be able to pay its debts as and when they fall due.

Without modifying our opinion, we draw attention to Note 1 to the financial statements, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared to assist Surf Life Saving Mid North Coast Branch Inc meet the requirements of the Associations Incorporations Act 2009. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose.
