PRESIDENT'S REPORT - 1997-98

It gives me great amount of pleasure to tender my report for the past year. There were many highlights and positive things happened throughout the Mid North Coast Branch and it is difficult to know where to start.

Firstly, a hearty welcome back to Macksville Scotts Head Club. Your joining of our Branch gave us a great injection of energy, strength and new ideas, and, we know Mid North Coast Branch will benefit greatly because of your presence as has already occurred this season.

The two major carnivals hosted by Mid North Coast Branch this year were outstanding successes. Firstly, the NSW Country JAC Carnival organised and conducted at South West Rocks were magnificently well run and all competitors and officials heaped praise on the South West Rocks organisation. Secondly, the NSW Country Surf Life Saving Championships staged at Rainbow Beach and organised by Wauchope Bonny Hills Club were a wonderfully organised Championships. The carnival could not have been better organised and Wauchope Bonny Hills deserve enormous praise for the venue and carnival organisation.

The decision by NSW Country Delegates to conduct this prestigous championship over one day as an experiment was however, a disaster financially for the host club and took away some of the gloss off what should have been the best ever Country Championships. So much work and effort was put in by the Wauchope Bonny Hills Club members and Community Organisations for a one-day carnival.

Hopefully no country club will be asked to stage this carnival under the same criteria as imposed on Wauchope Bonny Hills Club.

Congratulations to the Organising Committees of both South West Rocks and Wauchope Bonny Hills Clubs on the superb organisation of these two carnivals.

All Mid North Coast Branch Clubs (Macksville Scotts Head, South West Rocks, Hat Head, Kempsey Crescent Head, Port Macquarie, Tacking Point, Wauchope Bonny Hills and Camden Haven), carried out their Patrols well throughout a long season, and it is with great satisfaction that we can report "no lives lost on patrol, because of our Vigilance and Service". In Patrol Competitions throughout the Branch, Port Macquarie Club won this event by one point from Wauchope Bonny Hills on the day, whereas in the season's Patrol Efficiency and Inspections competition, Wauchope Bonny Hills and Macksville Scotts Head Clubs shared the honours with both Clubs scoring very highly.

Congratulations to Allan Barlin (Wauchope Bonny Hills Club). who took out the "Chalkie Bob Smith" sponsored shield as Male Life Saver of the Year for the Mld North Coast Branch. Allan's contribution throughout the Branch is a role model for all; his energy and dedication to Surf Life Saving this season has been enormous. The Female Life Saver of the Year was shared between Narelle Stokes (Wauchope Bonny Hills) and Natalie Cater (Kempsey Crescent Head). Both ladies made outstanding contributions to their Clubs throughout the season.

The judges had a very hard decision as there were so many excellent nominations for each of these awards.

Port Macquarie Club once again dominated the Carnival Points Scores and was the Champion Club of all carnivals throughout the season, and also at the Branch Championships.

Camden Haven Club has made tremendous improvements in their Club's general organisation, and they are reaping the benefits in so many ways. This season they won the Branch IRB Championships by a huge margin, running two teams in both the "A" and "B" divisions, and placed first and second in every event. Scott McDonald and Heath Balkin are to be congratulated on their dedication in this area. Camden Haven Club also took out the Masons Surf Rescue Challenge for the Mid North Coast Branch on their own beach in a well represented field of Clubs.

This season the Branch Championships also saw the inclusion of all Masters Age Divisions and events. The day was an outstanding success and enjoyed by all. Allan Barlin, our Director of Competition and Life Saving is to be congratulated on his vision in this regard.

Surf Clubs along the Mid North Coast Branch are having increasing problems with boardriders ignoring the flagged beach patrol areas, and regularly "thumb their noses" at the Voluntary Surf Patrol requests to observe these areas. Unless some statutory powers are given to Patrol Captains it is highly likely a serious accident will occur in the future. There are kilometres of beach where "boardies" can surf, but they continue to surf in the flagged areas which is the designated safe surfing area for the general public.

This season has been one of the worst on record for drownings on New South Wales beaches and the Premier's Task Force is being set up to address this major problem. Education is the key of course, because so many people simply "do not know" about the dangerous conditions of the surf. They ignore the Surf Patrol areas often to their great peril.

In trying to Educate the General Public, Surf Life Saving Mid North Coast Branch Inc., together with NSW Sport and Recreation and The NSW Masons has for the past four years gone into the Western NSW Schools and Communities on a tour of ten days, educating the general public on surf safety. In this regard our Branch Secretary, Max Waters, and Allan Barlin are to be congratulated on their endeavours.

Camden Haven Club took out the North Coast Boat Rowers Premiership this season, which was an enormous achievement and a credit to their teams and particularly to Doug Grimwood, their sweep and Club President.

The Bill Balkin Memorial Shield for the Point Score conducted at Mid North Coast Branch carnivals for the "A" boat races was won this year by South West Rocks on a count back from Camden Haven.

A special mention to Kempsey Crescent Head Club must be made this year. After many years of difficulty KCH is on the rise again. Thanks to the efforts of Secretary of the Branch Max Waters and special meetings of past and present club members the "two blues" appear to have a bright future. With Secretary Charlie Bowen (who was Branch Secretary forty years ago), assisting and young members like Natalie Cater (Branch Female Life Saver of the Year) together with stalwarts like Tim Trotter and the Conomos Family, all augurs well for Kempsey Crescent Head's future.

Mid North Coast Branch has functioned exceptionally well throughout the year with Branch meetings well attended on most occasions. The new Constitution should be ratified at this year's special meeting prior to the Annual General Meeting and should streamline the organisation.

The Board of Control has carried out many hours of Examinations, Education Seminars page 3

and officiated at all Mid North Coast Branch carnivals this season. It is pleasing that some officials are now being appointed at NSW State and Australian Championships. There is a need for more Board of Control Examiners and Carnival members however.

In concluding this report I must thank my fellow executive members: in particular Max Waters, our very hard working Secretary; Max devotes enormous amounts of his time on a voluntary basis to the administration of the Branch. In most of the other Branches the volume of work done by Max in our Branch, is done by professional administrators – we should keep this in mind for the near future.

To Allan Barlin, our Treasurer, Director of Competition and Life Saving, a number of jobs well done and obviously well acknowledged by all clubs in the Mid North Coast Branch.

To Bruce Caldwell, our long serving Honorary Registrar, who does such a great job in the recording of all club examinations and awards. Bruce is one of the unsung heroes of the Branch and continues to keep the history of the Branch in meticulously kept records, and follows in the footsteps of his dad, Mal Caldwell, who did the same job before Bruce. What a great occasion when the third generation of the Caldwell family (Liana Caldwell) was selected as Mid North Coast Branch JAC Female Life Saver of the Year.

To Past Presidents and Life Members, Kevin Ruscoe, Tony Hayes, Ray Agland and Club Delegates, my personal thanks.

The Mid North Coast Branch Annual Dinner and Presentation Evening held at South West Rocks Country Club was well attended with dignatories such as our local Members of Parliament and Local Government, the Masons, and Media Representatives were also there in numbers, and showed the high regard in which Surf Life Saving Mid North Coast Branch is held in the community.

Thanks to Paul Ninness, our Northern based Develop ment Oficer, who has assisted our Clubs in many ways. Paul organised the first of what we hope will be a long term Inter–School Surf Life Saving Carnival. The Carnival was held at Flynn's Beach, Port Macquarie and attended by most of the High Schools in the Branch.

To Paul Smith, OAM and the professional staff at NSW Life Saving Headquarters our appreciation for your assistance throughout the year.

It was fantastic to have our JAC's and Senior Clubs combine for the Annual Dinner and Presentation Evening at South West Rocks. With Graham Nash (President) and Cheryl Pearson's assistance the JAC's and Senior Clubs are drawing closer together and complete integration and co-operation is occurring. In the future we are hopeful of conducting joint Branch Carnival Championships over a full weekend.

This season Northpower has started a three year sponsorship with the four North Coast Branches. The sponsorship deal organised with Northpower is tremendous and will have major benefits for all Clubs and Branches. Secretary's Annual Report

for the Season 1997-98

Despite the horrific number of drownings along the New South Wales coastline during the past season, all clubs in the Branch can proudly say "no lives lost on our patrolled beaches". This augurs well for the professional capabilities of our life savers, and the performances as shown in the annual summary of returns brings great credit to this Association.

In many instances the preventative actions and skills of our life savers averted incidents that may have ended in a tragedy. Congratulations to all members on a job well done.

It is regrettable, but many members of the general public using the beaches, still persist in swimming outside designated Patrolled Areas; this action causes an extra strain on our life saving resources. All of the drownings last season, with the exception of one, that of Life Savere Bernie Kelly (who collapsed and died after assisting in the rescue of several youths at Maroubra Beach), were on unpatrolled beaches. SURELY THERE IS A MESSAGE HERE!

On the opposite end of the scale, we still have a large number of board riders who continually encroach on the designated Patrolled Areas. President Bob has mentioned this matter in his report. I believe that life savers should have some statute control over this problem.

Due to many aspects the past season appears to have been a long one; however, in actual fact it was one week longer than the previous season. The longlivity of the season may be because of more activity. As you will read in the President's and Director's of Life Saving and Director's of Competition reports the Branch and Clubs have been involved in many functions of surf life saving.

A big welcome to our new Club, Macksville Scotts Head, who decided to return "home" to the Mid North Coast Branch after an absence of forty three years. This Club has renewed the vitality in the Branch more awards better competition good friendships. Macksville Scots Head had some 203 Awards gained during the season. A good effort.

Not to be outdone, the remaining seven Clubs have also shown increases in their Awards, and from the Branch Registrar's report you will see that the Branch had an increase of approximately 80% in Awards over last season. This trend must continue, we must do everything possible to retain these members, for it spreads the patrolling and administrative duties to a greater number, thus easing the burden on our existing members.

The Branch Youth Development Weekend Camp for 13 to 16 year olds was not held this year. However, with the sponsorship of Northpower towards this activity it beholds the Branch to re-introduce this Weekend and the Clubs to support it. It is a great learning experience for the young participants and no doubt helps them towards a career in surf life saving.

The annual Under 14/Under 16 years surf carnival was extended to include the Under 18

years division. This Carnival was held at Hat Head and proved a very successful one. With more promotion this could become "one of the carnivals of the season". Members of Clubs from the North Coast and Lower North Coast Branches were invited to participate in this event. The point score was won by Port Macquarie Club.

The Branch association with the Branch Junior Activities Committee continues, and a more closer relationship now exists. Both Branches held a combined Annual Dinner and Presentation Evening at South West Rocks; this was an enjoyable occassion. My thanks to Cheryl Pearson (Secretary) and Graham Nash (President) for their co-operation.

Four new Examiners were elected at the recent annual meeting of the Board of Control, and with the influx of Examiners from Macksville Scotts Head Club, the number of Examiners now in the Branch totals fifty four. However, not all of these are Proficient and an effort is to be made prior to the coming season to have as many as possible of these complete and return the Examiners Proficiency Paper. Remember, only Proficient Examiners can officially carry out Award Examinations. Clubs are urged to encourage their members to join the Board of Examiners.

The Branch had several visits from members of Surf Life Saving New South Wales, Paul Smith OAM (Chief Executive Officer), Phillip Vanney (Dep. President Surf Life Saving New South Wales), Andrew Chubb (Chairman of the State Education Panel) conducted a Seminar on Bronze Medallion Examination for Examiners, Club Captains and Instructors at Kempsey in February, whilst a conference of Development Officers from around Australia was held at Tacking Point. This was organised by Andrew May (Office Manager), David Armstrong (Development Officer), Craig Andrews (Development Officer), and our own Northern Development Officer (Paul Ninness). This Conference was a great success. Unfortunately the weather was not very kind to the visitors.

Branch Director of Life Saving, Allan Barlin also conducted several seminars for Club Captains, and Instructors.

Paul Ninness, Northern Development Officer has been of assistance to the Branch and Clubs during the season; Paul attends most Branch meetings and is able to give advice and information when needed. Thank you, Paul for your help.

Two School training days were held in the Branch. These were organised by Paul Ninness; one was held at Port Macquarie's Flynns Beach and the other at Kempsey Crescent Head. These proved a great introduction to surf life saving to the school children.

To top this off, the first ever North Coast Schools League Carnival was held at Flynns Beach, at which teams from St. Pauls Kempsey, Melville Hlgh Kempsey, Port Macquarie High, and St. Joseph's Regional Schools participated. This was a successful venture and it is hoped to expand the format this coming season, and encourage more Schools to participate. Paul was assisted at the Carnival by Bob Smith, Bruce Caldwell, Allan Barlin and Max Waters, together with teachers from the schools. Who knows this concept could become a State-wide event.

Carnivals, both senior and junior were held, with some excellent performances by competitors. This continued on at Country, State and Australian carnivals.

For the fourth year I organised with the Department of Sport and Recereation a "Beach to the Bush" programme. Allan Barlin accompanied me on this occasion. The programme included visrts to 23 schools in the western areas of New South Wales and on this occasion was over a ten day period. Talks and Videos on surf life saving, water safety, sun cancer dangers etc., were given to over 2,800 children and 95 teachers. We also spoke at three service club meetings involving a further 108 people. Distance travelled was 2,700

kilometres. My thanks go to the New South Wales Masons (new sponsors for Surf Life Saving) the Department of Sport and Recreation, and in particular the Western Region of New South Wales Area Officer, Sandy Cook, Surf Life Saving New South Wales, and Wauchope Bonny Hills Surf Life Saving Club for the use of their IRB, Motor, Trailer and Rescue Board for use in the demonstrations. As in the past a colouring—in contest was held with this Education Tour, and my thanks go to the management of the Beachfront Regency Motel at Port Macquarie for providing a weeks holiday for four as the prize.

The Annual Dinner and Presentation Evening this year was held at South West Rocks Country Club, with the guest speaker being Phillip Vanney, Deputy President, Surf Life Saving New South Wales. Other guests at the evening included Members of Parliament (both State and Federal), NSW Masons, and representatives of TV, and Press. As mentioned earlier this function was held in conjunction with the Junior Activities Committee, and was very successful. The list of Champions, Point Score Winners etc., appears in the Director of Competition report.

SPONSORS:

The Surf Rescue Challenge now has a new sponsor in the New South Wales Masons. At the Branch competition we were pleased to have as our guests, several Masons and their wives from Port Macquarie and Laurieton area. The Masons expressed their appreciation and said they were amazed at the stamina of the competitors given the conditions that the that the event was held in.

NBN Television joined our list of sponsors this season. At the commencement of the season NBN televised a number of short segments on surf life saving that urged people to become lifesavers. This gesture was appreciated and I have no doubts that the programme will assist in obtaining members for the various Clubs.

Northpower has really come forth with what can only be described as a magnificent sponsorship package. All Clubs have received a copy of this proposal. The deal with Northpower was instigated through Kim Holdom and Peter McHenry (Country Branches personnel) and we must thank these two gentlemen for their efforts.

Impulse Airlines, though not called upon this season, are always ready to assist us with flight tickets.

MEDIA COVERAGE:

All Newspapers, Radio Stations and Television Stations within the Branch have been of great assistance in recording the activities of surf life saving clubs and members. This past season all clubs received good coverage.

COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIPS:

Congratulations to Wauchope Bonny Hills Surf Life Saving Club on the staging of the New South Wales Country Surf Championships. This event has been covered in the President's and Director's of Competition reports. May I here offer my congratulations to Bob Smith, Allan Barlin, all members of Wauchope Bonny Hills Surf Life Saving Club and the members of the Community Organisations that rallied around the Club to present a great carnival; however, it was unfortunate that the Carnival had been restricted to a one-day affair.

Despite your Branch Delegates wishes, and the wishes of all Branch Clubs, that the Carnival revert to a two-day one earlier in the season, the remainder of the NSW Country Branches delegates were adamant that the Carnival was to remain a one-day one. The results have now proved that the Mid North Coast Branch and Clubs and were right in endeavouring to change this situation.

RESCUES:





Bob Smith and Max Waters have represented the Branch at State Centre meetings and have raised several matters on behalf of the Branch; in particular the re-introduction of a Wave Ski and Under 16 Single Ski events. Both these matters have been referred to the Competition and Medical Panels for consideration.

Rushed through in the closing stages of the last meeting was a motion that all clubs and branches install computers and be on e-mail before December 1998. Lower North Coast Branch raised the question of financing of this project saying that not all clubs would be in a position to install this equipment. Our Branch agrees in part with the Lower North Coast Branch, but the powers that be had the numbers and the motion was carried with discussion being curtailed.

This decision may create a hardship with some clubs; however, State Centre executive believe that it will be a major cost saving to the Association. I feel that this is right a major cost saving to State Centre on labour, paper and postage, but what happens to the small country club that cannot install this equipment before December. I can see the cost saving to State Centre being borne by some Branches, to ensure the Clubs have the necessary information that will be on e-mail.

State Centre I believe were going to look into a possible supplier of the computors and ancillary equipment in bulk to the Association; this would ensure that all the necessary programmes would be installed. To date no further communication has been received from State Centre.

CONDOLENCE:

To all members of the Branch and Clubs who have suffered the loss of a loved one, we extend our sympathy.

LIFESAVERS OF THE YEAR:

For the first time the Executive included a Female Life Saver of the Year contest as well as a Male Life Saver of the Year. This move proved very popular and five ladies were nominated. Congratulations to Natalie Cater (Kempsey Crescent Head) and Narelle Stokes (Wauchope Bonny Hills) joint winners of this inaugural event. The competition was such that the judges could not separate these two nominees. Allan Barlin (Wauchope Bonny Hills) won the Male Life Saver of the Year from two other contestants. These three now have their names engraved on the "Chalkie Bob Smith" Shield.

CLUB DINNERS AND PRESENTATIONS:

Many Clubs have already had their annual dinners and presentation evenings. These are great nights and gives the Club the opportunity to recognise the services and dedication of its members in the cause of Surf Life Saving.

CONSTITUTION:


The Constitution Committee have prepared a new Constitution for the Branch. Copies of this have been forwarded to Clubs for perusal and the new Constitution will be presented to a Special Meeting prior to the Annual General Meeting for its adoption. This Constitution will replace the existing one which has now become outdated.

Whilst on the Constitution, Club Executive's and Member's (and this includes J.A.C.'s) attention is drawn to the fact that approval MUST be sought from the Branch before a Club can participate in a display, parade, procession or fund raising venture organised by any other organisation, or by the Club if it is not being held at the Club's normal place of activity (Club House or Beach). Participation in such an event without approval nullifies the Association's insurance policies. When seeking approval, don't leave it to the last

The eight clubs making up our Branch have maintained good patrols during the season, and it is pleasing to report of no loss of life while patrols on duty. Congratulations, and well done to those who have performed rescues, resuscitation and/or preventative actions keeping our beaches safe for everyone. A special mention to those Clubs and in particular the members who have performed duties, rescues, searches, in out of hours situations. A special Meritorious Award was presented to Ethan Rolfe for his rescue late in the previous season; well done, Ethan.

It is pleasing to see most Patrols wearing the correct attire when approached on Patrol inspections, remembering that the first impression the general public get of lifesavers is their appearance and dress. Congratulations to Macksville Scotts Head and Wauchope

Bonny Hills for tying in the Patrol Inspection portion of the season.

All Clubs have been reasonably active in training people for SLSA Awards in Life Saving Certificate, Bronze Medallion, IRB, First Aid, Advanced Resuscitation CErtificate, Radio Operator and Advanced Lifesaver. Instructors and Examiners in most of these awards have also been gained. A huge imput into the Branches awards number can be attributed to Macksville Scotts Head. The continuing training of members in awards augers well for the continuing improvement of our movement.

Twenty three rescues were performed with over 60 preventative actions recorded. Lifesavers first-aid skills were tested with over 150 incidents of injury.

SUMMARY OF CLUB ANNUAL REPORT

In the 58 years of operation season 1997-98 has broken all records.

- Finance reported a record income.
- Club membership totalled 655 plus 92 Junior members.
- Awards gained totalled 204.

We "went home", back to the Mid North Coast Branch and were made to feel most welcome by the Clubs, members and administration. Our worries about "whether we were doing the right thing" have been well and truly justified.

We have added approximately \$34,000 in equipment to our stock including a new surf boat, sweep oar and set of oars. A new Arancia IRB. 2 new Evinrude motors. New rescue tubes. New radio. Pal manakin, A couple of skis (1 second hand and new and 2 second hand boards and a new rescue board.

On the fundraising side we have had a busy year. Macadamia nut picking \$1,000. Annual surf carnival \$5,500. Pizza weekend in conjunction with BP Macksville \$1,250. Mitre 10 sponsorship for resuscitation demonstration training unit \$3,500. various government grants totalling \$19,650)

Our members did well in the competition arena picking up Country, State and medals both open and masters. Branch championships saw a few of our club members gain Branch champion status, and 3 members have been chosen to represent Country on a tour to New Zealand. We also had members who were finalists in various categories in the NSW Masons Lifesaver of the Year

Administration wise we have completed a very amicable Deed of Agreement with our Shire Council who we hold a close relationship with. The Club will have in place by the start of next season a working Development Plan. It has taken us a lot of time and effort to complete but will be worth it. We recommend all Clubs have a go at creating one. All sections of the Life saving movement at our Club will be run as self funding.

To make all of the above possible, we pay tribute and say thank you to the best Club members, best supporters and social members and best sponsors any sporting organisation can have.

Finally to bring everything into perspective we pay tribute to Bernard Kelly from South Maroubra Surf Club who lost his life trying to save other lives which is the real reason our Club and the movement exists. We recorded no lives lost on our patrolled beach, 62 preventative actions, 1 rescue, 1 resuscitation, 44 marine stings, 6 minor cases of first aid and 4 major cases of first aid where patients were transported to hospital by ambulance.

ANNUAL REPORT 1997/98 SEASON

Wauchope Bonny Hills SLSC has had what appears to many members as a long season (no longer than usual in reality) due predominately to the holding of the Country Championships at Rainbow Beach. The Championships were a resounding success, against odds of a one day format and an infestation of very venomous bluebottles. The Local Organising Committee can be justly proud of their efforts.

Patrol membership has fallen this year to 48 Active and 4 Active Reserve. These members patrolled for the 69 days of the season (weekends and public holidays) culminating in a total of 1650 hours. Two (2) members attained 100% and another 3 gained Patrol Efficiency (getting substitutes when absent). Highest number of hours was 59 hours. Seven members clocked up more than 40 hours when the overall average was 34 hours.
