

Max Waters O.A.M.

My personal congratulations, and the entire Mid North Coast Branch congratulations, are extended to our very hard working Branch Secretary, Max Waters on being awarded The Order of Australia Medal in the Queen's Birthday Honours List.

Max Waters O.A.M., becomes the first Surf Life Saving Mid North Coast Branch recipient of this great honour in history. Max thoroughly deserves his O.A.M. awarded for his long and dedicated service to Surf Life Saving which started when he gained his Bronze Medallion in 1947 with Black Head S.L.S.C. In 1951 he was appointed as an Examiner, and joined Port Macquarie Club, and was awarded Life Membership of that Club in 1969 after giving great service. In 1971, Mid North Coast Branch conferred Life Membership on Max after serving as Branch Secretary from 1949 to 1958, then three years as a Vice President; 1961 saw him take on the position of Branch Superintendent, a position he held until 1973 with the exception of two years.

Max organised and instigated the first of the North Coast Branches Championships at Port Macquarie. These Championships later changed to the N.S.W. Country Championships.

Max left the district in 1973 and moved to Grenfell and for fourteen years involved himself with the Department of Recreation Learn to Swim Campaigns and Pre-School Water Safety, as well as being involved in Royal Life Saving. Max was awarded The Paul Harris Fellowship (the highest award granted in Rotary) while in Grenfell for his services to Rotary.

Since returning to Port Macquarie in 1989 Max has stepped up his involvement in Surf Life Saving (if that is possible) and has held positions as Branch Superintendent, Director of Life Saving, Education Officer, Coaching Advisor and Chairperson of the Branch Youth Development Programme as well as being Branch Secretary. Max this year was awarded a special plaque from Austswim and Sports and Recreation at Parliament House, Sydney, for "the greatest contribution in 1998 to Water Safety – Education".

Max was awarded his 50 years Service Badge to Surf Life Saving in 1996, with thirty three years as an executive member of a Club and Branch.

Amongst his many great achievements in Surf Life Saving — his vision and organisation saw the Beach to Bush Education Programmes commenced in 1994. Since then Max's programmes have been taken to countless thousands of Primary School students, to the North Western and Western Regions of N.S.W. giving the message of Surf Safety and Water Safety. The Beach to Bush Programmes from 1994 to 1998 have brought great honour to our Branch and Surf Life Saving in general. There are so many excellent innovations in Educational Programmes for Surf Life Saving that can be attributed to Max Waters. His O.A.M. awarded on 14th June, 1999 simply read in the citation "For Service to Surf Life Saving, particularly as an Administrator, Educator and Judge."

Congratulations from each and everyone of us Max Waters O.A.M. - a long overdue and well deserved honour.

Mid North Coast Branch has had a very successful year with many highlights. Included in these were:-

- * Allan Barlin being awarded N.S.W. Carnival Official of the Year at the Awards of Excellence Dinner.
- * "Chalkie" Bob Smith being presented with Life Membership of N.S.W. Surf Life Saving at the N.S.W. Championships, at Collnarra.
- * Max Waters and Allan Barlin being recognised and receiving a Major Award for their services to Austswim and Water Safety from the N.S.W. Sport and Recreation and Austswim at Parliament House, Sydney.
- * Mid North Coast Branch continuing to educate the students of schools in the North West and Western Regions through the "Beach to Bush" programme with Max Waters, Bob Smith, Alan Taylor, Giselle Taylor and Rod Taylor all contributing their services. Wauchope Bonny Hills Surf Life Saving Club continues to donate their IRB, trailer and rescue equipment for these Educational Tours.
- * To our Branch representatives namely: Rod McDonagh (South West Rocks Surf Life Saving Club), as Assistant Manager of the N.S.W. Surf Life Saving team touring South Africa; Rod Taylor and wife Giselle (Macksville Scotts Head Surf Life Saving Club), as members of the N.S.W. Country Touring Team to New Zealand.
- * Jason Bryant's (Tacking Point Surf Life Saving Club), who made a most heroic rescue on the treacherous Port Macquarie bar, to safely rescue seven people. Jason will be recommended for Bravery Awards for his magnificent and heroic efforts.
- * Tony Hayes (South West Rocks Surf Life Saving Club), has been acknowledged for his dedication to Surf Life Saving and will be awarded Life Membership of Surf Life Saving N.S.W. at the 1999/2000 State Championships.
- * Ken Corbett (Tacking Point Surf Life Saving Club), who has served Mid North Coast Branch as Branch Super. and Examiner for many years, has been awarded Life Membership of Mid North Coast Branch.

It was a privilege to have our State C.E.O., Paul Smith OAM, as our guest speaker at the Annual Presentation Dinner at Crescent Head

Country Club. Major Awards presented for the evening included:-

- * Branch Male Life Saver of the Year: Manfred Sonntag (WBH).
- * Branch Female Life Saver of the Year: Sheryl Pearson (SWR). both were presented with individal awards and had their names engraved on the "Chalkie" Bob Smith Shield.
- * Mid North Coast Branch Champion Club, Port Macquarie, also easily won the N.S.W. Country Champion Point Score at Tathra.
- * Camden Haven Club took out the Masons' Rescue Challenge for the second successive year and represented our Branch very well in the Masons' Championship finals at Coogee.
- * Camden Haven Club also won (by default) the Branch IRB Championship when they were the only Club entered. In fact, they had two teams ready to participate.
- * The Northpower sponsored "Rookie of the Year" programme was a success, with Dean Kerry, of Hat Head Surf Life Saving Club being selected as Branch "Rookie of the Year". We expect this programme to really take off this coming season when all Clubs realise how beneficial it can be.
- * The Bill Balkin Memorial Boat Race point score held over the season was won by Macksville Scotts Head Surf Life Saving Club.
- * Max Waters and two members of Hat Head Surf Life Saving Club (Nicole Webster and Natasha Crilley) flew the flag at the Tamworth Country Music Festival, when with the Masonic Lodges of the Tamworth district, entered a marvellous Surf Life Saving float (IRB, rescue board, rescue tube, patrol flags etc.,) in the two kilometre procession down Peel Street, in front of more than 70,000 spectators.
- * Max Waters, with two members of Kempsey Crescent Head Surf Life Saving Club (Emma Yabsley and Natalie Cater), conducted a surf and water safety education programme with the children of Primary Schools in the Macleay River region.
 - * Our hard working Registrar and Life Member, Bruce Caldwell has put together a wonderful programme on the newly acquired Branch computer. He has entered every Award gained by Mid North Coast Branch Clubs, together with the Examiners of those Awards. Bruce is endeavouring to gather together the complete history of our Branch and is doing an amazing job in this regard.

Our thanks go out to the various Clubs, including the JAC's for their assistance throughout the year. At Branch level integration appears to be improving greatly with more and more activities encouraging integration. The success of the Mid North Coast Branch Team at the N.S.W. Inter Branches Championships under the Managership and Coaching of Greg Bell, all augurs well for our future success in competition and member retention.

From a Life Saving point it is pleasing to report no lives lost, when patrols on duty. Life Saving Director, Mike ("Cactus") Moran is to be congratulated for his endeavours to lift our standing with

Patrol Inspections, and the N.S.W. Life Saving Advisers visiting our Clubs.

The Patrol Efficiency Competition was taken out jointly by our two strongest Clubs, Macksville Scotts Head and Port Macquarie.

Our Masters Competitors representing Clubs from Mid North Coast Branch were well to the fore at N.S.W. and Australian Championships, with Wauchope Bonny Hills Club members, George Fowler, "Beaurepaire" Bob Smith and "Chalkie" Bob Smith, taking out eleven medals at N.S.W. and two medals at the Australian titles. Ritchie Donovan, of Macksville Scotts Head Club also did well at the N.S.W. and Australian titles in the Masters.

Northern Development Officer, Giselle Taylor (Addison). organised highly a successful Kelloggs' Surf Education/Competition day at Flynns Beach, Port Macquarie. Schools in the Branch from Macksville to Camden Haven were represented and a great day was had by all. Giselle and all Branch Officials who helped are to be congratulated on their efforts.

SECRETARY'S AMMUAL REPORT

for the Season 1998-99

It is pleasing to report another year with "no lives lost on our patrolled beaches". This is something that the Branch, Clubs and Members can be proud off. Once again there were a large number of drownings in New South Wales, both on the coast and inland. It is difficult to understand the attitude of many people who use our wonderful surf and waterways; surely common sense should prevail. We look forward to the coming season, hoping that the number of drownings can be reduced.

A number of our members have been abused by the general public for just doing their job. However, I am certain that these people would not be so abusive should they be placed in a position requiring being rescued. The attitude of "that it wont happen to me" seems to prevail with this type of person.

Preventative actions by many of our life savers, and their skills no doubt have averted many drowings, and I extend my congratulations to all members on a job well done.

Details are given elsewhere in this report of the rescues etc that have been made.

The past season has been a varying one examinations have decreased; competition at carnival has still been good, but the number of competitors has decreased; rescues, preventative actions and first aid still remain on the high list. Next season let us set our sights on an increase in examinations and membership. If we can do this the duties of patrolling and administration by clubs becomes easier.

Sponsored by Northpower a Youth Development Camp was held at Macksville Scotts Head. This was an outstanding success and our thanks must go the the members of Macksville Scotts Head on the wonderful organisation and staging of this Camp.

Northpower's "Rookie of the Year" contest was finalised with three Clubs nominating a candidate each. This was eventually won by Dean Kerry, of Hat Head Surf Life Saving Club. Northpower will be continuing its sponsorship of the "Rookie of the Year" contest next season and it is up to the Clubs to get in, and participate in this event. It is designed to make surf life saving interesting and enjoyable for the younger members.

Again on youth the Branch Under 14, Under 16 and Under 18 carnival was held at Hat Head beach, and proved to be a very successful one. Apart from a number of our Branch Clubs, visitors were present from the Lower and North Coast Branches. More participation by our local Clubs would make this "one of the best junior carnivals" on the coast.

The Branch continues to have a close relationship with the Branch Junior Activities Committee; both groups again combining for the Annual Dinner and Presentation function, this year held at Crescent Head.

Two new Examiners were elected at the recent meeting of the Board of Control. Congratulations to Alan Newman, of Macksville Scotts Head Surf Life Saving Club, and Scott MacDonald, of Camden Haven Surf Life Saving Club on attaining this award. Emma Yabsley, of Kempsey Crescent Head Surf Life Saving Club has been nominated and accepted as a Probationary Examiner. Congratulations.

A perusal of our list of Examiners and Probationers shows that we now have forty six members on the Board of Control; unfortunately not all of these members are Proficient or active, and a more concerted effort must be made to increase our active Examiners to lessen the work load on the few who are continually carrying out examinations and attending carnivals. Once again, I urge all Clubs to look at their membership, ascertain if they have any members prepared to present themselves as Examiners, make contact with the Board of Control Secretary, and have their nomination put forward.

Several visits were made to the Branch by members and officers of Surf Life Saving New South Wales, namely Paul Smith, OAM (Chief Executive Officer), Andrew Chubb and Charlene Wellard (State Education Panel), Graham Howard (State Director of Life Saving and Education), David Armstrong (Senior Development Officer), and Giselle Addison (North Coast Development Officer). We thank these officers for their interest and input into our Branch.

Branch Director of Competition, Allan Barlin is to be congratulated on his winning the New South Wales Masons Award of Excellence for Carnival Official of the Year. Allan's efforts over the past year has been tremendous, having not missed a Branch, Country, State or Australian Championship Carnival. Apart from this, Allan also conducted a number of Accreditation Seminars within our Branch. A great effort that may never be emulated.

A North Coast Schools League Carnival was held at Flynns Beach; this was organised by North Coast Development Officer, Giselle Addison and attended by students from St. Pauls Kempsey, Melville High Kempsey, Kempsey High, Port Macquarie High, Bowraville Central, and Kendall Central. The format was different from last season, with instruction on surf awareness, surf, beach and board riding skills and IRB crewing being given prior to the carnival, by members of the Mid North Coast Branch.

As mentioned earlier, carnivals were held with a decrease in the number of competitors. However, those who did participate did so with distinction; Port Macquarie Club won the overall Point Score at this year's Country Championships; Branch Club members participated in the Country, State and Australian championships.

The Masons Rescue Challenge was held at Camden Haven with four crews taking part. The overall winners were the host club, Camden Haven, who represented the Branch at the State Finals at Coogee. Although unsuccessful at State the team performed well. At Camden Haven the Branch acted as hosts to sixteen Masons and their wives. Details of the competition were explained to the Masons, who expressed their pleasure at being invited to attend.

I have attended Masonic meetings at Laurieton and Kempsey and with President Bob attended a meeting a Port Macquarie, at which details of the Masons "Beach to Bush" sponsorship was explained. These meetings have proved very beneficial for the Branch; we thank the Laurieton and Port Macquarie Lodges for their financial contributions to the Branch of \$900 being a direct donation and the proceeds of a bowls day; Port Macquarie Masons are at present conducting a competition, raising funds to secure sufficient "Ten Surf Safety Hints" brochures to be placed in local motels, as part of Masons community service. This project should benefit Surf Life Saving with education to the general public on surf awareness.

The Branch Dinner and Presentation Evening was held at the Crescent Head Country Club; we had 113 in attendance, the largest ever. Special guest was Paul Smith, OAM,

who gave a brief, but enlightening address on some of the past and future activities of Surf Life Saving New South Wales.

Our Dinner/Presentation function is becoming a great social event each season. 113 this year, and two Clubs were not represented. Let's hope we can get a full Club representation next year. Difficult, I know, but maybe we can organise ourselves better so that functions are not clashing.

Other special guests were: Robert Oakshott MP, Member for Port Macquarie; Andrew Stoner, MP, Member for Oxley and Mrs. Stoner, Garry Nehl, MHR, Member for Cowper and Mrs. Nehl, and representing the Masonic Lodges in our Branch area, Mr. and Mrs. John Sanders, Mr. and Mrs. Geoff Morgan, Mr. and Mrs. Ashley Cummins, and Keith Moore. A welcome was also extended to Life Members, Ray Agland, Tony Hayes, Bob Smith and Max Waters. Mention was also made of the recent Life Membership to Surf Life Saving New South Wales, of Tony Hayes.

SPONSORS:

Our thanks to our sponsors: the New South Wales Masons for their sponsorship to the Surf Rescue Challenge for 1998-99 sseason. This was won by Camden Haven Surf Life Saving Club in a tricky surf. The local Masons who attended the function were greatly impressed with the competition.

NBN has continued its sponsorship, televising a number of short segments on surf safety hints, and the joining of a surf club. These segments have been appreciated. Towards the end of the season NBN announced that they would be supplying each Club in our Branch with a Patrol Sun Shade. Presentation of these shades has now been scheduled for the commencement of next season. The presentation will be made to representatives of all Branch Clubs at Tacking Point Surf Life Saving Club House to be followd by a barbecue and refreshments. Clubs will be advised of the exact date later.

Northpower's sponsorship is now being fully realised by Club members, with special grants to Clubs and Branch, and the "Rookie" programme. This sponsorship, I believe, is to continue for at least another three seasons. Apart from this assistance, Northpower signage for Club Houses should be in place before next season.

Impulse Airlines are always ready to assist with a flight ticket if needed.

MEDIA COVERAGE:

All newspapers, radio stations and television stations within the Branch have been of assistance in recording the activities of our surf life saving clubs and members, and the promotion of surf safety hints to the general public.

CONDOLENCE:

To all members of the Branch and Clubs who have suffered the loss of a loved one, we extend our sympathy.

CLUB DINNERS AND PRESENTATIONS:

Most Clubs have held their annual dinners and presentation evenings. These are great evenings in which to wind up the season and to recognise the services and dedication of members in the cause of surf life saving.

BEACH TO BUSH PROGRAMME:

The "Beach to Bush" programme is expanding with extra time being allocated to visit the schools in the western and north western areas of New South Wales. I have been transferred from the Orange Sports and Recreation area to the Tamworth Sports and Rescreation area; however, I did complete one week of lectures in the Orange area this season.

This week commenced at Narromine and concluded at Cobar. Alan Newman, of Macksville Scotts Head Surf Life Saving Club accompanied me on this trip. We spoke to 1008 school children, 45 teachers, 1 Mason, 23 Rotarians, visited 14 schools and gave 16 one hour lectures. Distance travelled was 2064 kilometres.

In the Tamworth area, our President, Bob Smith, accompanied me on the first week which commenced at Narrabri and finished at Barraba, this took in what is known as the Pilliga Region. We spoke to 1023 school children, 61 teachers, 7 parents, 16 Masons, 20 Apexians. Visited 15 schools and gave 18 one hour lectures and travelled 1023 kilometres. The Apex meeting we attended was without a doubt the highlight of this trip. Bob's mother was born in the Bingarra region and the trip to this area was of significant importance to him, having the opportunity to seeing relatives names on the school Honour Roll and talking with relatives at the school.

This was the first time that the "Beach to Bush" programmes for me included high schools. It was difficult to gain the students' interest in some cases, with virtually no questions being asked, due mainly, I feel to "peer" pressure. However, at schools at which we overcame this problem, the questions came very promptly.

The third and fourth weeks were in the north western region of the Tamworth Sports and Recreation area. Surf Life Saving's newly appointed Development Officer, Giselle Addison, accompanied me on the first week; her husband, Rod Taylor, joined us for the second week. The event of the first week was our vehicle being bogged trying to get to Maules Creek School.

This was a big area to cover, commencing at Boggabri and concluding at Brewarrina, a distance of 3825 kolimetres. We spoke to 2919 school children, 163 teachers, 4 Masons, 20 Rotarians, visited 17 schools and gave 29 one hour lectures.

Totals for the four week programme: 4950 school children, 269 teachers, 21 Masons, 43 Rotarians, 20 Apexians. visited 46 schools and gave 63 one hour lectures. Distance travelled was 6912 kilometres. Number of people spoken to on surf and water safety was 5310.

LOCAL SCHOOLS EDUCATION:

With a portion of Northpower sponsorship money, and with the approval of Branch President, Bob Smith, I visited, in the company of Emma Yabsley and Natalie Cater, of Kempsey Crescent Head Surf Life Saving Club, thirteen schools in the Macleay region, delivering the message of surf and water safety. The team was very well received and from the comments of the teachers, was a worthy project coming at the right time, just prior to the school holidays. the team spoke to 1359 school children, 20 teachers, 22 members of Lions and Rotary Clubs, visited 13 schools and travelled 900 kilometres.

The local project I feel is one that we should continue with if at all possible. It has been assumed that because people live near the coast, the programme on surf and water safety is not necessary. Let me assure you that the programme was well received by the local children and teachers.

Compare these figures with those of last year and you will see that: there were 39 more rescues made without gear; 2 less with the rescue tube; 4 less with the rescue board; 3 less with the IRB; 5 more with other gear (surf boat); an increase of 35 rescues overall; and 2 less resuscitation. However, there was a dramatic increase in preventative actions, up by 765.

These increases were due no doubt to what can only be described as a season of atrocious seas.

These figures would be increased with the inclusion of those from Kempsey Crescent Head.

VALUE OF CLUB PREMISES AND EQUIPMENT

With only seven of our eight Branch clubs submitting annual summary of returns it is difficult to obtain a true value of club equipment and premises. The figures submitted by the clubs shows a big increase in equipment to \$523,000 and a modest increase in premises to \$2,622,500.

An estimate of Kempsey Crescent Head Club's equipment would be in the vicinity of \$30,000; whilst the Club premises would be around \$300,000, not included in the above totals.





Director of Life Saving Report 1998-99....

My first year as Director of Lifesaving for the Mid
North Coast, at the beginning of the season it looked
as it was going to be a hard year.

I asked State Centre to supply some officers to talk
to Camden Haven, Wauchope Bonny Hills, Kempsey Crescent
Head and Hat Head, as Camden Haven, Hat Head and Tacking
Point asked if they could delete Saturday patrols I
granted this to these clubs until the Christmas School
holidays Tacking Point and Camden Haven gained more
members and rostered patrols for the Saturdays and have
continued, I thank Andrew May, David Armstrong and Giselle
Taylor for attending the Branch, although our timming
with Kempsey Crescent Head went astray.
The second visit was by Andrew Chubb and Charlie Wellard
to Crescent Head for the examiners accreditation I was
pleased with the attendance as all clubs had representation,
this was to explain the new training modules and that
all examiners were doing the same thing.

Awards are down this year, against last year and these will continue to decrease and increase from year to year because of a catch up.


I have been happy with the patrols this year but would like a few more inspections.

Director of Competition Report 1998-99....

This year has been extremely busy for competitors and officials.

A well attended Level One officials course was held at South West Rocks, those officials attending carnivals during the season will soon receive their badges,

South West Rocks Carnival, a great opener to the season (81 competitors, 8 officials),

Port Macquarie Open Carnival, where the Boat section was incorporated into the overall carnival with boaties being able to compete in other events (if they wished),95 competitors, 13 officials.

The u14/u18 Carnival at Hat Head was again a resounding success with competitors from the JAC movement able to compete alongside those from the *senior* ranks as well as other branches, 53 competitors, 11 officials.

Macksville Scotts Head held a "monster" weekend of Masters (48 competitors, 9 officials)

and Open (136 competitors, 16 officials) carnivals,




