



The "MASTERS" of Wauchope - Bonny Hills Surf Life Saving Club Inc.



George won two Bronze Medals; "Beaurepaire" Bob secured at Bronze Medal, and "Chalkie" Bob a Silver Medal at the World Championships.

The three have competed successfully over the last few years in Masters Events at Club, Country, State and Australian Championships and the World Titles was "the cream on the cake", an experience that will never be forgotten.

"Chalkie" Bob would be one of the greatest life savers in Australia, having won many Branch, Country, State and Australian Championships in open competition; he has won New South Wales Life Saver of Year on two occasions. Teams coached by him have gone on to win Branch, Country, State and Australian Titles.

Secretary's Report

No lives lost on our Patrolled beaches can be reported for the 1999-2000 season. This is a great achievement and something that the Branch, Clubs and Members can be proud of. Whilst drownings continue in New South Wales, I feel a re-inforced programme of education must be introduced to overcome this catastrophy.

Preventative actions by our life savers, and their skills no doubt have been the mainstay in keeping our beaches safe.

Unlike last season, the Branch had an increase in examinations; however, our Registrar has issued a warning that unless our Bronze Medallion awards are increased then Clubs could face serious problems with manning patrols in the not too distant future. Carnival competition has remained static with only the Masters events showing any increase in numbers. Of concern to officials is the poor attendance of Under 14, Under 16 and Under 18 competitors for their special carnival. I agree that the timing of this event may have been wrong, but when you look at the carnival programme asked for by the Clubs there leaves very few dates available for the Branch run Under 14, 16, 18's event. Let us remember that it is these members who will be the managers of surf life saving in the future; we should take every opportunity to see that an attractive competitive programme is provided at a time suitable for them. Whilst the programme is probably adequate, let us look to better timing.

Northpower has once again been a force with its sponsorship of the Branch and Clubs; functions run under this sponsorship included the Northpower Youth Development Camp at Macksville Scotts Head for Junior Activity members; and the Northpower "Rookie" Development Day at Hat Head. These were well organized and enjoyed by the young life savers. There could have been a better attendance at Hat Head by both participants and instructors.

The Branch had well over 140 participants in the Northpower "Rookie of the Year" competition with something like eighty completing the programme. All Clubs had a nominee for the final judging; the winner was Gavin Hanna, of South West Rocks Club. Gavin and the other finalists were present at the Branch Dinner and Presentation evening when the announcement of the winner was made. The presentation of a plaque and jacket was made to Gavan by John Sheather representing Northpower. All other-participants received a certificate.

NBN Television continue their sponsorship. Prior to the commencement of the season a special afternoon was held on Tacking Point Beach where magnificent Patrol Sun Shades were presented to each Club in our Branch and the Lower North Coast Branch. These Sun Shades have proved invaluable to Clubs in providing necessary "duty of care" to their members. Media coverage has also been forthcoming for most of the Club's and Branch's events, and we look forward to this association continuing.

The New South Wales Masonic Lodges continue to support the Branch with the sponsoring of the Masons Rescue Challenge held at Camden Haven. The event won by Macksville Scotts Head was a thriller, with the winner being decided on the last event. At this function the Branch played host to

eighteen local Lodge members and their wives. It was a pleasant afternoon, enjoyed by all. The day was concluded with refreshments and a barbecue for our official guests, competitors and Branch officials.

At a local level the Lodges at Port Macquarie have again made a financial contribution to the Branch; provided 5000 surf safety tips brochures to the Port Macquarie Motels and Estate Agents for distribution to visitors, and at the Dinner and Presentation Evening a Perpetual Shield and replica were presented to President Allan Barlin for a Point Score Handicap Competition beginning next season. It is hoped that this competition will an incentive for the smaller clubs.

The Port Macquarie Lodges in conjunction with the Branch entered a life saving float in the annual Easter Festival a Port Macquarie. Thanks to Wauchope Bonny Hills for making gear available, Allan Barlin for delivery and return of same; to Rachael and Sarah Barlin for their part in handing out brochures; and to the Masons who helped construct the float. We didn't win a prize, but the message of surf safety was put before a huge crowd. Already the Masons are planning a bigger and better float for next festival.

Impulse Airlines are always ready to assist with a flight ticket if required.

A North Coast Schools League Carnival was again held at Flynns Beach, with students from a number of the district high schools attending. The sea did not favour the day, and a number of procedures had to be cancelled. However, all enjoyed themselves and no doubt it will be on again next year.

Very few visits from State Centre Officers this Season. CEO Paul Smith OAM, followed by John Fraser and Andrew May twice on GST matters; and Andrew Chubb and Les Miller (Patrol Captains/Life Support programmes).

The Branch Dinner and Presentation Evening was again held at Crescent Head Country Club with 134 people being in attendance; our largest function yet. The function was well represented by all Clubs as well as a number of our Patrons and special guests. This function is improving each year and is certainly becoming "a must" on the surf social calender.

The winners of Awards appears in the Director of Competition and Director of Life Saving reports.

A new award this year was the Proficiency Award for Club Secretaries: this was won by Cynthia Smith, of Camden Haven Club.

MEDIA COVERAGE:

Once again the local newspapers, radio stations and television stations within the Branch have been of assistance in recording the activities of our Clubs and members, and the promotion of surf safety hints to the general public.

CONDOLENCE:

To all members of the Branch and Clubs who have suffered the loss of a loved one, we extend our sympathy.

CLUB DINNERS AND PRESENTATIONS:

The majority of Clubs have now held their presentation functions, and have honoured their outstanding members with special awards.

BEACH TO BUSH PROGRAMME:

This programme still continues with Scott McDonald, Camden Haven, taking part in a programme in the North Western part of New South Wales.

LACK OF COMMUNICATION/PROTOCOL:

It was unfortunate that on several occasions this season a break down of communications/protocal, existed between the Branch and New South Wales State Centre. Letters written by State Centre Officers at times taking up to fourteen days to reach the Branch. One glaring event was when all clubs were notified that a Patrol Captains/Life Support programme would be held at Tacking Point Surf Club. This programme was arranged by NSW State Centre Officers without consultation with Branch Executive. Only three clubs responded, and in discussion it was agreed that there was a communication breakdown. As Branch Secretary I received notification by letter on Monday, the day after the weekend set down for the course.

This is more compounded when one realises that this matter was discussed at the Branch February meeting, when it was decided that the time and venue set by State Centre was not suitable to members of Branch Clubs (the weekend between the State and Australian Surf Championships) at Lennox Head. At this meeting, at which a State Centre Officer was present, it was decided that the Branch would make application for such a Programme in the off season, at a time suitable to all concerned.

ATTENDANCE AT MEETINGS:

Attendance at Branch meetings improved slightly from the past season. Nine meetings were held during the season with each Club averaging an attendance of 1.43 representatives. This was an increase from 1.268 last season.

With each Club having two delegates each entitled to attend the results are particularly low; the attendance of the Club Presidents or their proxies helped bring the numbers up. The first figure shown is the average for delegates, the second figure that of the President or Proxy and the final figure the Club's average attendance for each meeting:

Macksville Scotts Head: .88; .33 = 1.21.

South West Rocks: 1.33; .44 = 1.77.

Hat Head: .22; .66 = .88.

Port Macquarie: 1.22; 1.00 = 2.22.

Tacking Point: 1.00; .66 = 1.66.

Wauchope Bonny Hills: 1.55; .66 = 2.21.

Camden Haven: .88; .66 = 1.54.

The attendance from the Executive was good with J. Moran, B. Caldwell, M. Moran, H. Mackay attending all nine meetings; and M. Waters, A. Barlin and D. O'Sullivan attending eight.

Clubs are urged to appoint delegates who will be responsible and attend the monthly meetings. It is from these meetings that Clubs obtain a lot of information relating to life saving activities.

The Clubs have improved with their Patrols; Tacking Point and Hat Head are the big improvers.

Our beaches have been safe and no lives lost where there is a Patrol - although there has been lives lost through drowning on the coastline and inland; this will continue and nothing will change, not even with all the funds provided for television and radio advertisements by the government.

This year we received a visit from Les Miller and Andrew Chubb. This meeting was held at Tacking Point. State Centre seem to get the idea that things are not well in the bush. Three Clubs turned up, Wauchope Bonny Hills, Tacking Point and Camden Haven. Those that didn't turn up, must feel that there Clubs are alright and the three that turned up, also had no complaints.

Awards are up from last season. Bruce Caldwell will have these details; some Club Instructors are burnt out.

Clubs have held their Patrols together in one way or another due to the early start of rugby league and other sports because of the Olympic Games, which is dragging the bush to a standstill.

Clubs in this Branch do not intend to Patrol early next year because of the Games; the season will start at the beginning of the September school holidays if they are still at the normal times; all summer sports are affected with the Games.

Monthly activities reports from South West Rocks and four a month sometimes from Tacking Point; these two Clubs appear to be the only ones interested.

I would like to thank all Supervisors, who did their jobs, but there were occasions where I was let down. I would like to see some new Supervisors as

some Supervisors wish to be replaced. I must mention Louis Ballangarry, who had the longest distance to travel, and did not ask for one cent - South West Bocks was his Club.

Once again the Branch Development Day was a success with an improvement in numbers from the junior clubs - only one club did not send any participants.

The Northpower "Rookie" Day was not attended as well as the Development Day; disappointed were the Officials who put this programme together. Let's hope this will improve as it did from the first year. This programme must be held early in the season.

Still have not heard anything about Hat Head's new IRB hull application; I have been informed verbally that it has been handed on to National Council.

During the year a number of Patrol inspections were held by some Supervisors and myself.

Board of Youth Development will need to form a Working Committee to be able to put programmes into place with our Development Camp; the "Rookies" programme also needs more attention.

New Awards, Patrol Captains Accreditation, Life Support: Louis Ballangarry and Owen Ragan have been to a Seminar and are the only two accredited for these awards in the Branch. There is to be a change up-date for the First Aid Course.

As I said last year, we are only as good as we can be; we need new members. Some members think that they are there to compete and not do Patrol work. Looking at the Masters' events, I wonder how some of them could do a Proficiency.

I would like to thank all Examiners for their dedication and help to the Clubs and the Branch.

During the year we were to hold a few Board of Control meetings; these did not eventuate, due to extra work load; some members are running their Club's and doing Branch work - examining and carnivals. We must also remember that some of us have families, and most of all we work for a living and have homes and gardens to maintain. Remember we are volunteers and we try to keep the surf movement afloat.

Director of Competition

The first carnival of the season was round 1 of the combined northern branches series hosted by lower North Coast Branch at Black Head. Attendance was poor from most branches and did not improve much for following rounds at South West Rock and Woolgoolga. The final round schedule for Yamba was abandoned mainly due to a total lack of interest by the far North Coast Branch and the series appears to have died a natural death after one season. Congratulations are due to Port Macquarie for attending each of the 3 rounds held and winning the aggregate point score for the series.

The annual School League carnival, held at Flynns Beach on Friday, 5 November, was a little disappointing for the participants due to big seas. Most water events were cancelled and special thanks go to the officials who managed to take a day off work to organise events and instruct the participants in SLS water safety.

Kempsey Crescent Head club rounded up half the village for work parties to ensure a well catered for double carnival on 7 November with a full program for Nippers, Open and veteran competitors. Despite some minor discontent, almost all clubs were happy with the format and at least one double (Jnr/Snr) carnival appears likely to be held each season.

Camden Haven hosted the Branch Masons Surf Rescue Challenge on 5 December and it was pleasing to see five clubs participating (plus a second crew from C.H.). Port Macquarie very sportingly handicapped themselves with a brand new motor having a top speed of 3 knots and this seemed to be appreciated by the other clubs. A number of masons from within the Branch attended the carnival to see Macksville Scotts Head take home the major prize of a competition board. Results MSH 21, CH (B) 17, PM + CH (w) 15

The Masons sponsorship of Surf Life Saving is appreciated by all clubs and the Branch extends its sincere thanks and appreciation to the Masonic lodges in our region both for their general sponsorship and for the excellent competition board trophy for our branch champions.

Hat Head hosted a very poorly attended under 14, 16, 18 carnival on 18 December in conjunction with a weekend youth development camp. One week before Christmas was probably the worst possible time to hold such an event and the branch should give serious consideration to the schedule, format and benefits of future events of this type.

Port Macquarie double (Vets/Open) carnival on 8,9 January was the first for the new millennium and was again well attended by 18 clubs. P.M. narrowly defeated the powerful visiting veterans team from Dixon Park to retain the veterans pointscore trophy. The open carnival was another numbers game with P.M. comfortably winning the pointscore. One of the advantages of a Flynns Beach carnival is the presence of surf boats in the main competition area which always creates spectator interest. Since rounds of boat events alternating with board and ski events definitely adds a little colour and interest to carnivals, the Branch should give consideration to returning to the format of having only one competition area for our carnivals. MNC Branch Championships were held at Hat Head on 20 February in a small surf. The host club set an example for other clubs in the Branch by setting up both beach and water areas in ample time for the carnival start. Thank you Hat Head. Branch medals and ribbons were presented on the day for 1st , 2nd & 3rd for all events. Results. PM 402, WBH 237, TP 236, MSH 188

Tacking Point open carnival scheduled for 13 February was postponed due to heavy seas and was subsequently held in April after the state, national and world titles. An April carnival was always going to be risky but the major carnivals roster left TP with no other choice.

In spite of another big and testing surf and in spite of only 3 clubs attending, the carnival was a day of great camaraderie and the 3 special events on the program (dash for cash, quadrathon and 2km beach run) helped make the carnival a success. Results TP 147, PM 104, SWR 18

Tacking Point carnival was also the venue for the Branch IRB championships. The disappointment of only 2 clubs presenting teams was compensated for by the entertainment value of the competitors. 10 minutes before start time Wauchope Bonny Hills volunteered to demonstrate IRB roll over procedure for the amusement of the dwindling spectator crowd. 40 minutes later the competition began and it was discovered that the restart procedure was not entirely successful. However the WBH driver elected to integrate arm strengthening exercises into his motor starting skills and the carnival proceeded.

The other team (Camden Haven) was obviously becoming a little peeved by the attention seeking tactics of WBH and in a well orchestrated movement in the middle of the break and during the final event, the CH crewman abandoned ship in a desperate attempt to win spectator attention for his team. The CH driver then proceed to entertain the crowd with numerous parallel runs and in and out passes in a tricky surf until, tiring of the lime lights, he retrieved his crewman and finished the event.

Registrar's Report

Awards for the previous season of 1999/2000 have increased by 21. This is due to an increase in IRB Driver Certificates and Surf Rescue Certificates. This is the second season that Bronze Medallions have declined in number.

If this trend continues for the next couple of seasons, some clubs may find it difficult to fulfill their patrol obligations.

At the Annual General Meeting last season each Club was handed a laminated flow chart on procedures regarding the filling out of report forms, namely 14A and 14B. During the past season I have noticed that some Clubs are only sending in ONE COPY of each Form. On the flow chart I asked for both copies of the 14A and 14B to be sent to me. The reason why I have asked for this to happen is that the forms are carbon impregnated and the copy that I receive is quite often very difficult to read, and I do like the correct information to go to NSW State Centre so that when the award comes back to you, the club, everything is correct.

When carrying our Award Up Dates the only awards that I require to be recorded on the 14B are Up Dates for ARC, ARCE, IRBD and IRBE, there is no need to send other award Up Dates.

Please do not hold onto 14A and 14B work cards after examinations have been carried out. SEND THEM IN PROMPTLY. The quicker you send them in, the quicker I can have them endorsed and sent to Sydney.

I would just like to thank the clubs that have sent their paper work in correctly and promptly during the last season; it makes my job that much easier.

Finally, I would like to wish all clubs a successful 2000/2001 season.

Treasurer's Report

The 1999-2000 season has been financially better than the previous years. The Branch had an income of \$50,017.03 and an expenditure of \$42,403.06, with a credit result of \$7,613.97, rather than a loss.

This was budgeted for and I would suggest that the Branch hold another Financial Committee meeting at the beginning of the season to control the money in the Branch for the 2000/2001 season.

The Branch really never lost money in the previous season; however, we did have a large quantity of stationery on hand, most of which has been absorbed this season.

With the GST coming into effect from the 1st July, 2000, I would like to see orders for stationery, when current stocks have been sold, being made direct to State Centre by all Clubs. Last season a number of the Clubs were slow to make the payment of their accounts.

Last season I did not account the Clubs for the use of the Carnival Trailer and Gear at Carnivals. This was to be charged for their uses at \$50 for Carnivals and \$25 for Special Events Carnivals.

I would like to thank North Power for their sponsorship of the Branch and also for the Clubs; the Coastline Credit Union for its support for the Inter-Branch Team; the Masonic Lodges of the District for their support of the Masonic Rescue Challenge and other events.

Thanks to Max Waters for the job done as Secretary, which he carries out well, and covers every thing that has to be done; this makes the other Executives of the Branch work load a lot easier. I know this is right, as Max has everything covered for our monthly meetings.

Thanks also to Allan Barlin, as President; he does a marvelous job handling all the Clubs and keeping up to date with the changes in surf life saving.

I wish the Branch all the best for the coming season.

This 1999-2000 season has seen an increase in membership at both senior and junior level. We had a record number of awards along with an increase in participation at local, State, Country and Australian carnivals.


We have increased our Patrol Hours on Saturdays, Sundays, and Public Holidays from 9.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m.

As I will be standing down from this position. I would like to take the opportunity in wishing the new secretary the best of luck






