



President's Report

Once again the nearly 700 members of Surf Life Saving clubs of the Mid North Coast have patrolled the beaches of the area with distinction

during the 2003/04 season. In doing so they managed to perform almost 17,000 hours of voluntary community service and I am pleased to give the report that all members of this Association love to hear that "no lives were lost while patrols were on duty".

Last year Life member Ray Agland was selected as the Macleay Citizen of the Year. This year he went one better and was awarded an Order of Australia Medal in the Australia Day Honours List for his services to Surf Life Saving and the Kempsey Community.

Ray was awarded Life membership of Kempsey Crescent Head in August, 1983 and the Branch in July, 1994. Ray has held many positions within the Crescent Head club. Branch positions include Treasurer for many years from 1978, Deputy Superintendent, Team Manager, Accident Investigation Officer and Power Boat Officer. He was also a member of all Branch sub-committees finance, constitution, life, judiciary, meritorious and selection. Ray is also a life member of many other sporting and community organizations on the Macleay.

In being awarded the O.A.M., Ray joins Branch Life Members Max Waters and Chalkie Bob Smith who have also received this honour.

Just rewards to a member who has contributed outstanding service.

Another notable milestone during the season was 5 members obtaining 50-Year Service Awards. These awards were granted to the one and only Allan 'Digit' Dick from Port Macquarie, Life Member and former Branch President and Secretary, Tony Hayes and the evergreens Garry Gillies and Terry Trevillion from South West Rocks and Life Member, John Vipond from Camden Haven.

In addition, Jamie Martin, John Purnell and Col Owen from Port Macquarie were granted 25-Year Service Awards. I have little doubt that there are many members out there who are eligible for these awards and urge the clubs to nominate them.

On a sadder note, we were sorry to learn of the passing of Reg Saunders in June 2003 aged 94. Reg did his Bronze at South West Rocks in 1941 and focused on training of members and the provision of life saving services as Chief Instructor for 10 years. He was Branch Superintendent for 6 years and President for 7 years. He was awarded Life Membership of the Rocks in 1959, the Branch in 1966, SLSNSW in 1961 and Surf Life Saving Australia in 1964. Reg was a strict R&R coach in the days when discipline was the name of the game and a respected judge for 18 years with 10 years experience at Australian Championship level. The Branch had not seen a lot of Reg in recent times but his contribution over many years was enormous.

The Executive

After the trials and tribulation of last season and the retirement of stalwarts Cactus and Judy Moran, the Branch had a relatively new and inexperienced Executive in 2003/04, which naturally enough had some teething problems.

The role of Deputy President was filled by Rod McDonagh for the second year and Rod filled in well on a number of occasions as well as assisting me a great deal. Rod and I met with the Chairman of the Organizational Review Task Force and key members of the State Executive at the Australian to discuss Branch issues and the Debriefing sessions were exhausting.

Peter Murphy took on the position of Secretary and played the role of five eight passing the ball on to the clubs. Unfortunately, many of them do not seem to read emails and miss important messages. The Branch was not able to recruit a minute secretary and this is an area that will need to be addressed.

Mick Lang stepped up to the plate as Director of Competition and had a huge year officiating at every carnival going, running a Level 1 Officials course and. fulfilling his club commitments.

Election to the role of Director of Lifesaving and Education would appear to be a hex. The one and only 'Cactus' Michael Moran gave the job away mainly through ill health and Ken Corbett took on the role only to be plagued by illness. Graham Bingham looked at the job but had to decline because of other unforeseen commitments and Hugh Mackay finally accepted the position only to be beset by his own problems. This year Mike Stevenson has been recommended as Director by the Board of Control and it is good to see some new blood. Mike was for many years secretary of the juniors.

The standard of Patrols and Examinations confirmed that the Club Supervisors had the situation well in hand and there were some very good results. The Board of Control Numbers, however, are not what they might be and there will need to be a concerted effort to increase them in the forthcoming season.

Stewart Dowrick took on the Treasurer's job and produced colourful reports which at times appeared to have every one bewildered.

Bruce Caldwell was once again Registrar and did his usual excellent job with. Bruce is right on top of this position actually understands the Complete Patrol Logger, which created havoc in a number of areas. This year will be Bruce's 20th in this position and the Branch would be in dire straits without him. He is a Life Member of both the Branch and SLSNSW.

The Junior Activities Group was again led by Chairman Peter Cross and again proved to be an extremely effective Committee. The Executive consisted of Peter, Mike Stevenson, Don Mackenzie, Steve Rice, David Croad, Kerry Fisher, Graham Mason and Karen Young and I congratulate all of them on their efforts.

I am particularly impressed with their attitude in trying to support and strengthen clubs that appear to be struggling. I have also heard excellent reports on the Junior Development Camp.

Youth Development was taken on by the younger members of the Branch with Matt Smith leading the charge. They took a leading role in organizing the Hat Head under 14/16/19 Carnival and the ocean swim at South West Rocks.

Sponsorship

This year the SLSA received its largest sponsorship ever from carriers, DHL who provided every patrolling member with a new uniform and funds to assist the running of the Branch.

NBN television continued its sponsorship of both the Branch and individual clubs and has just forwarded a new sponsorship offer for the next 3 years.

The Banana Coast Credit Union again donated a Wayne McAdam Rescue Board, which was won by Tacking Point.

Another effort, which should not pass without note, was the fund raising associated with the Yamaha Tribal Gathering in Port Macquarie, which raised valuable funds towards the cost of the Branch. Yamaha who are great Association supporters conducted this 2 day event which included a simulated dirt bike ride which proved very popular and the Branch collected a 'gold coin' donation. It brought back all sorts of memories of Bucket Brigades at traffic lights in Sydney in a former life.

The Freemasons (Masonicare) again sponsored the Association's Leadership camp and the Branch had 2 participants, Timica Hawkins (Hat Head) and Meagen Morris (Tacking Point). Members that have been on this course

Telstra have provided direct assistance to 2 clubs.

Competition

Rod Mc Donagh managed the Branch team with Larry Brook as coach and the team acquitted itself well in the Interbranch at Forster. For the first time, the boat crews were female crews and I must admit that they brought a new enthusiasm to the event. The Branch was represented by Macksville Scotts Head and their presence in the team was refreshing. There will be a NSW Country Team touring New Zealand in January competing the Tri-Series against the Central Coast and North Region (NZ). Hopefully the Mid North Coast will be well represented.

The North Coast Academy of Sport through the sponsorship from the Port Macquarie Panthers club again conducted the North Coast Surf Life Saving Programme and this Branch had 6 members selected in the squad. These were Mitchell Dawson, Andrew Gordon, Brent Mason, Ryan Rosenbaum, and Carla and Jenna Witched. This Branch also provided Coach Larry Brook and Programme Secretary Mick Lang.

Nomination have now been called for next years programme and I urge members to submit applications as it will improve both knowledge and performance. If applications are not submitted it is difficult to get members selected in this squad or any representative teams for that matter.

Country Championships

South West Rocks hosted the Country Championships and did a brilliant job in atrocious conditions. Rain fell continuously for the first 2 days when the Junior Carnival was being conducted and it was generally miserable conditions for all concerned. The weather cleared up for the seniors but was replaced by rugged surf conditions which necessitated moving the boat area. This generally creates havoc at a carnival but it is a compliment to the Rocks that everything went fairly smoothly. Some of Rod McDonagh's crew that impressed me with their efforts were Debbie Scott, Rebecca Mitchell, Anne Pierce, Roger Wilkinson and Terry Trevillion who was tireless and a host of others too numerous to mention individually.

The previous sponsor of the Titles declined this year and Rod McDonagh managed to secured local sponsorship from Work Directions without whom the Championships could not have been conducted successfully

Next year the Country Championships are scheduled for Pambula on the Far South Coast and a big effort will be required to reach the standard achieved at the Rocks.

Mid North Coast Carnivals

There were a number of carnivals held locally starting with the combined Junior/Senior carnival at Crescent Head which was quite successful especially as the Competition Officials Course was conducted the day before and gave new officials the opportunity to be blooded.

This was followed by the Macksville Scotts Head Double Header. As is becoming the norm the Masters carnival on the Satuday was very well attended. Numbers for the Open Carnival were disappointing but this could have been due to the North Coast Boat series conducting heats separately on another section of the beach.

In my mind there is little doubt that the Boat Series is having a detrimental effect on Open Carnivals and there wil probably be clashes with local carnivals this season as occurred lats season. The Branch policy in regard to giving clearances to compete outside the Branch when there is a local carnival still stands and I believe the Branch should address it before the beginning of the season. I must admit I was more than a little surprised that with the number of crews that were reportedly competing that there was only one crew at the State Titles.

Hat Head again conducted the U14/16/19 carnival and although numbers were down it was enjoyed by all concerned.

Port Macquarie conducted a Double Header in January again and although numbers were down on previous years for the Masters, it was still a great day. The Open carnival, however, was very disappointing and was almost an Interclub between Port and Tacking Point which if nothing else ensured plenty of feeling.

Port have indicated that they intend to vary this format next year by conducting a Masters in January and the Open on the Saturday of the Todd Holden Junior Carnival which traditional is held on the weekend between the Stat and Australian.

The Branch Championships were held at Bonny Hills with the Overall Point Score keenly contested between, Port Macquarie, Tacking Point and Wauchope Bonny Hills with Port through weight of numbers just holding out a strong Tacking Point finish.

NSW Championships

Branch Representation at the NSW Championships at Shellharbour was very poor with only 4 starters at the Open Championships. SLSNSW still expected the Branch to provide an IRB and crew and at one stage we were not going to be allowed to compete. It turned out that Greg Smith from Port Macquarie and Owen Reagen from Macksville Scotts Head were there although we had not taken our own 'duck'. After many phone calls the crisis was averted. Fortunately it looks like this rule will be reviewed next year.

There were some good results at the Masters particularly for Wauchope Bonny Hills and Tacking Point and the clubs have detailed them in their reports. I congratulate all those that won medals

Despite the number of boat crews that are competing in the North Coast Boat Series only one Masters and no Open crews competed at the State.

Australian Championships

There was a better roll up for the Australian Championships and some good results were achieved by Wauchope Bonny Hills and Tacking Point. It is good to see that Tacking Point picked up gold for the first time and I congratulate all those that achieved success and their clubs.

The Future

The Australian Championships are to be held at Kurrawa for the next 2 years and then go west to Scarboro in Perth for 3 years followed by 3 years in Coffs Habour.

As Mick Lang has reported elsewhere an exciting proposal next year is the inaugural East Coast Championship and Interstate 'War on water' challenge set down for Tacking Point in February. This event should represent a departure from previous events and should be an exciting spectacle which should put Surf Life Saving in the spotlight locally which should be good for all our clubs.

In addition the Far North Coast Branch is keen to re-establish the North Coast Championships next year.

Community Education

Community Education is an area where I believe that there is crying need and the Branch should be looking to lift its profile in the future. This role was undertaken by Meredith Robertson who was extremely enthusiastic.

An application has been submitted for a grant to purchase equipment to allow us to conduct programmes more effectively and hopefully we will be able to develop an programme such as the one that allowed us to win a NSW Water Safety Awards 2 seasons ago.

Branch Annual Dinner and Awards

SLSNSW was represented by the popular Director of Life Saving and Education who came bearing gifts. This was not the reason he was invited but we weren't about to knock anything back.

The Branch and each club was presented with a cheque for \$2,000 from the Telemarketing. The Branch was presented with an Airway Management Trainer, a Defibrilation Trainer and Cartridge/Pads from the Bequest Funding.

It is an area that will need to be addressed in the forthcoming season.

The Future

At the May meeting the Branch resolved to hold a Planning Weekend to try and map out the future direction of the Branch. At the time I indicated that although I felt it was desperately required for both the Branch and its constituent clubs. The only interest in the proposal, however, has come from Rod McDonagh who has been chasing up venues and it would appear that we could put something together on 21/22 August.

The Branch exists to look after the interest of the 8 member clubs equally. If we do not resolve the current problems at both the Branch and club level, we are in for a lot of grief.

I do not believe that the current situation can be allowed to just float along and that there needs to be a change in attitude NOW.

Accordingly I intend to put the proposal to the meeting on Thursday night seeking a commitment from the clubs and Branch Officers. We will be looking for a minimum of 4 from each club representing a different area of the club from Juniors, young members, management, education, life saving and competition. It would be a 'live in' conference without the option of going home.

It would appear that if we can get some support from SLSNSW and the Branch subsidises it to the extent of say \$3,000 we could charge about \$50/head. I would be asking the clubs to pay for their representatives.

DIRECTOR LIFESAVING & EDUCATION

I am pleased to report that no lives were lost during MNC Branch voluntary patrols in the 2003-2004 season.

Kempsey Crescent Head surf club assisted with the recovery of a body at Big Nobby cliff in June last year and I acknowledge with thanks the assistance of Mark Baxter, Hugh Scott and Paul Waterhouse in that incident.

South West Rocks produced a savage shore break on the Saturday of Country Championships which resulted in a number of injuries including a suspected spinal and a near drowning due to exhaustion in the surf conditions. Both patients recovered.

The position of Director Lifesaving was shared by three members during the season. Ken Corbett was the elected DLS but due to injury he was forced to resign after several months. Graham Bingham was then appointed DLS and after a short time he too had to resign due to sudden family commitments. There being no enthusiastic applicants for the position led to my appointment and, since good things come in threes, I found myself grounded for several months.

The Board of Control's new policy of granting district supervisors more responsibility and more hands on contact with the clubs they are supervising has clearly been of great assistance to the Branch during the times of virtual absence of a director.

I thank all district supervisors for their work during the season and it is only with the knowledge that all of my district supervisors have the experience and commitment to perform their duties unsupervised, that I was content that lifesaving standards in the branch were being upheld in a friendly and encouraging manner.

The individual Supervisors reported that both Patrols and Examinations were generally of a high standard.

It was appropriate that the Tom Saul trophy for Patrol Efficiency could be presented by a Councillor Saul who is a relation to the South West Rocks club at the Annual Presentation.

At the Board of Control Annual Meeting, I submit several proposed BOC policies for consideration by the Board and recommendations to the Branch for the future assistance of the Board, the Director, Supervisors and clubs.

The Branch Constitution currently reflects the former situation where there was only one qualification which covered both examination and instruction and competition. When separate qualifications were introduced and the role of Superintendent split into the two directorships, no provision was made for the many people who held a single qualification and the Board has catered for Examiners and people with dual qualifications but not competition.

It was my intention with the proposed policies and constitutional changes that the competition aspect be addressed and that in the life saving area that all levels of the Board and clubs officers and club members would know what was expected of them throughout the Branch and the Director of Lifesaving position would become more of an administrative position with hands on contact and assistance where identified by policies or requested by officers of clubs or branch.

The Board did not endorse the recommendations and recommended that the incoming DLS and District Supervisors determine the format for Patrol Inspections.

The Constitutional problem has not been resolved, however, and it is considered that the Constitution Committee should examine the position to bring the Constitution into line with current practice.

Notwithstanding the feeling that I may owe the Branch something for directing an almost dormant Board of Control (on an administration level) for that past half year, I will be both relieved and thankful to hand over the job to a keen and enthusiastic new director.

Mike Stevenson has been nominated to fill the position for 2004/5 and I am confident that he will do an excellent job and wish him well.

DIRECTOR OF COMPETITION AND COACHING.

The season has come and gone so quickly it is hard to see where the time went. As this was my first season as your Director of Competition I would like to thank all Club Presidents, Secretaries and Team Managers for their assistance and patience during this season. It was a steep learning curve for me, but one I thoroughly enjoyed.

At this point I would like to especially thank Bruce Caldwell, Chalky Bob Smith, Dennis O'Sullivan & Hugh McKay, for their advice and guidance when I first took up this position last year, their wisdom and experience has been of enormous value to me and I can't thank you enough.

I suppose this is a time for reflection on the past season and identify what is working and what we need to improve.

OFFICIALS:

This season saw approximately 30 new officials complete the Level 1 Officials Course. I congratulate each of those new officials and I encourage you to continue your commitment in this area. With the introduction of one official for each 10 competitors for all carnivals from now on this is an area we need to keep an eye on in the future at both a Club and Branch level.

I encourage experienced officials from each of the Clubs to meet with their rookie officials and encourage them to attend as many carnivals as possible. Try to forge some sort of buddy system within your own Club for officials. A good way to do this is to meet your Club's coaches and set a day when your Club officials speak to your competitors for about 30minutes and discuss the rules of one aspect of competition, e.g., an ironman event. This could be done 4 or 5 times during the off season. It creates camaraderie within your own Club as well as assisting competitors to understand the rules of competition, not to mention refreshing your own understanding. It is only an idea, but one which may assist your Club and our Branch.

INTERBRANCH:

On reflection we had what I would class a reasonable Interbranch. I am acutely aware it is difficult to compete against some of the larger Branches, but I was disappointed at the number of competitors who were originally selected and then dropped out for various reasons. For me at that early stage in the season and my appointment as the Director of Competition this was an area I needed to look at and see what needed to be done to improve it.

As you are aware at a previous Branch meeting I mentioned having a junior and senior Interbranch Squad for the off season. My aim is to meet at least 3 times during the winter. At these sessions, I will encourage our rookie officials to attend to discuss the rules and any changes to the rules of competition. My aim is to have Club coaches attend and assist in the running of various disciplines, i.e., flags, beach sprints, board, ski and swim.

These clinics I believe will improve the skills of each of the selected members, so they can at least match it with some of their more illustrious competitors as well as improve the morale and camaraderie within our branch. Hopefully it will bring a new and refreshing feel to our Interbranch Team.

Having said that it may also assist in a resurgence to our early Branch carnivals, as competition hopefully will be keen amongst the 'off season' squad to battle out for positions as well as members who weren't originally selected.

CARNIVALS:

This is an area I believe needs improving and an injection of something different.

Next Season I would like to see shorter distance events and enduro type events.

Not every carnival would have these events, but some selected carnivals would have some of these types of events.

As a Branch we need to try something different to entice more competitors at our carnivals.

COACHES & OFFICIALS:

I am keen to run a coaches course for the Branch, but I need approval from State Centre to conduct same. When I have the necessary approval/assistance and dates, I will inform all Club secretaries of the venue, times and dates.

This is an area I am keen to improve for all Clubs. If there was an area I feel I neglected this season the coaching and development of our competitors was one area.

I will also attempt to put together another officials course for the Branch as well during the off season, time permitting.

At the time of writing I have not listed the awards winners for this season, but they will be acknowledged and rewarded at our Branch Presentation on Saturday the 29 May, 2004.

CONCLUSION:

Again I would like to thank everyone who has assisted me this season. I think we are heading in the right direction and we have some talented athletes in our Branch, we just need to work smarter and work together to improve Competition within our Branch.

I also believe we need to work with the Juniors to assist the juniors coming through for their first year in Senior Competition. This is an aspect I will try to work on through the off season.

Congratulations to all members who participated at State and Aussies. Hopefully next season we will have more competitors at these carnivals.

REGISTRAR

2003/2004 season has come and gone at a rate of knots. Once again the season started at a hectic pace with a training day for club CPL operators held at South West Rocks during September of 2003. This day was well attended by all clubs where many questions were asked and hopefully answered, along with hands on training for the clubs that brought their computers along for the day.

This season has seen a decline in the number of awards gained by Branch clubs. Awards are down by 39 from the previous season, (down 45 season 2002/2003). If this trend continues for the next couple of seasons than some clubs could be in deep trouble with membership and patrolling duties. Bronze Medallions are down 11 and Surf Rescue Certificates are down 14. Maybe it is time for all Branch clubs to have a long hard look at their community education programmes if we wish for our great voluntary organization to continue on the Mid North Coast. Another big concern is the lack of Silver Medallion IRB Driver awards gained within the clubs. There were only 6 SM/IRBD'S gained. Also there were very few internal awards being gained by members of all clubs which is also a worry to the Branch.

Now that all awards and proficiencies are processed through the CPL programme we can see the complete break down of awards that have been carried out and processed by the clubs. A total of 1218 awards, proficiencies, updates and JAC awards were carried out. Of these 417 were JAC awards, 536 were proficiencies and updates, which leaves 265 Surf Life Saving awards gained by 8 clubs

I would like to thank the Branch executive Dos, Peter, Stewart, Rod, Hughie and Mick for their help and support during the season. Also I would like to thank the CPL operators (Chris, Debbie, Rebecca, Jodie, Sue, Maurie, Ken, Warren, Paul, Sue, Sean and Peter) from the eight clubs for putting up their hands and running the CPL programmes on behalf of their clubs. I would also like to offer my sincere thanks to Margaret Black from the North Coast Branch who once again came and helped with instruction at the training day at South West Rocks, and has helped me with problems from clubs during the season via the telephone.

Finally I would like to wish all clubs a successful 2004/2005 season.



Overall we were pleased with results and hope that everyone who came enjoyed themselves.


We must thank our local community for their help and support.

Special mention should be made of the following members: Peter Murphy, Brent Mason, Fintan Langan, Mitchell Dawson, Tony Long, Darren Stevens, Dave Rickwood & Sharon Beard who completed the Officials Course and can now officiate at all types of Carnivals throughout Australia.

Our Club's River Swim was again a huge success and was run in conjunction with the Australian Long Course Triathlon. A huge thankyou for all who assisted, participated and supported the event.

The Club also applied for and were granted a Telstra Sports Star. We have been assigned Craig Malzard. I don't really know what sport he participates in but he is sponsored by Telstra at a National level.

SOCIAL:

The past season saw our Club hold a number of social/fund raising functions. These included, the Ladies shopping trip, Men's State of Origin trip, Music Trivia night, TAFE dinner, Annual Presentation night, New Years Eve function as well as our popular first and third Friday drinks.

Our club has once again experienced an outstanding season in many areas.:

PATROLS:

9 Patrols patrolled The main section in front of our clubhouse on Rainbow Beach. We also continued our hourly surveillance along the entire length of Rainbow Beach(3K)on the clubs quadbike and also around to Bartletts Beach with our I.R.B. These patrols were every Saturday afternoon ,all day Sunday and on all public Holidays. Patrols were generally well attended .

RESCUES AND FIRST-AID:

Because of our patrols vigilance and preventative action rescues were kept to an absolute minimum with only 3 actual rescues and 11 First aid cases required. The Top Patrolling Members for the Season included: Chalkie Bob Smith, Greg Jamieson, Graham Buckley, Warren Bowley, Leanne Goggin, David Goggin, David Stokes, Alan Suters, Wayne Gill, Martin Hogenboom, Steve Monaghan and Scott Williams.

AWARDS GAINED;

This is an area our club fell away last season and this needs to be addressed quickly. Only 4 Bronze Medallions, 1A.R.C, 1Defibrilators Certificate, 1Examiners Certificate(B>M) and 4 Level 1 Carnival Officials awards were gained. As with most country clubs many of our Junior members are lost to the city after their H.S.C. exams with employment and tertiary studies. However the J.A.Cs award numbers have been strong thanks to our excellent JAC instructor Leanne Goggin's efforts.

MEMBERSHIP:

Membership is strong but unless our awards increase next season active patrols strength will start to decrease. We need to encourage more of our JAC parents to become involved.

COMPETITION:

Another outstanding year for our clubs competitors. Once again our three Masters(Beaurepaire Bob Smith, Chalkie Bob Smith OAM and George Fowler) were very successful taking all before them at Branch Level.

At N.S.W. State level with only the three of them competing they won 11medals and 5 fourth placings to finish third in the Country points score. At the Australian Championships held at Kurrawa the dynamic trio won a further 4 medals and had three 4th placings. The 160years boat crew were very unlucky in their final when placed fourth with four boats on the same wave at the finish. WAUCHOPE BONNY HILLS placed second on the masters points score for all country clubs in Australia. Over thirty of our competitors competed at the Australian Championships mainly in the Boat and beach event area. We had 5 boat crews competing with all going past the preliminary sections. Our under 19boys boat crews (2) made it through to the quarter finals only to be crunched at the start when they had been touted as one of the favourites for the final. Our Ladies beach competitors including Rachel and Corrine Buckley, Jenna Levore, Tahnee Laws and Natalie Flanagan competed well and made it through to the semi finals of the Open Women's Beach Relay.

At the N.S.W. Country Championships held at South West Rocks held over a four day period with our JACs on the first two days(in very wet and windy conditions our top competitors were rewarded with a number of medals. In the Senior carnival with dangerous surf conditions prevailing our Ladies Beach Competitors were great. THE OPEN LADIES BEACH RELAY TEAM(Rachel and Corrine Buckley, Jenna Levore, Tahnee Laws and Natalie Flanagan won this event for the THIRD SUCCESSIVE TIME. They beat into second place the Mollymook team who went on to win the Australian Title at Kurrawa. Natalie and Corrine also won medals in beach sprints and beach flags with Kane Charles and Daniel Ross also winning silver and bronze medals in the beach flags events. Our Boat crews competed very well as usual in huge seas.

AT MID NORTH COAST BRANCH CHAMPIONSHIPS our Masters competitors, our ladies Beach competitors and or Mens Beach competitors and our Boat crews were supreme .Unfortunately very few of our competitors like to compete in the surf races and we finished third behind Port Macquarie and Tacking Point Clubs. FOR THE FIFTH YEAR in a row our Boat crews were champions of the branch and took out the Bill Balkan memorial boat premiership. OUR UNDOUBTED COMPETITOR OF THE YEAR was Beaurepaire Bob Smith.

CLUBHOUSE:

Through the leadership of David Stokes our clubhouse interior has improved significantly. We have a new kitchen, new office, and have had our floors sanded and polished for the first time in 40 years. The interior of the upstairs section has all been repainted and when all of our honour boards and photos are in place we can once again be proud of our history section. After two years of trying to get council to move we still do not have a new lease on a property we have build 41 years ago and there is an urgent need for council to maintain the outside section of the clubhouse and remedy some of the dangerous defects to the building. We are also anxious to extend our footprint and make additions to our clubhouse to take advantage of opportunities arising in our growth area. Hopefully Council will move quickly for us in the near future in this regard.

President's Report

2003/04 Patrol season member numbers were still low with only 28 patrolling members making up 4 patrols. Both patrol attendance and patrol hours were excellent, with over half patrolling members giving over 50 hours each.

Total patrolling hours in excess of 1500 hours were spent on the beach with 161 preventative actions, 12 First Aids, 10 Rescues and 1 30hp motor successfully rescued from the bottom of the bar.

SLSA Lifesaving Awards

Camden Haven Surf Lifesaving Club members attained a modest range of awards for the size of the club. Most members attained a new award, the Crew Persons award which has been designed to educate members so as to reduce injuries for crew members in the Inflatable Rescue Boat. Other awards include the prestigious Gold Medallion, Surf Rescue Certificate and Bronze Medallion.

In addition the majority of members completed annual proficiencies for the awards attained in previous seasons. For a club of less then 50 patrolling members within a community no greater then 5000 persons, the volume of awards and diversity of those awards can only be appreciated when compared against much larger clubs, who have much greater resources and trainers and examiners.

The members are to be congratulated on having attained the various awards this season and other seasons and are encouraged to fully use their competencies to increase the number of members qualified in various areas through training and examining next season.

Rescues

No major rescues were recorded for the season. This could be due to a number of factors. Patrols have been successful in limiting rescue situations by selecting wave zones of low risk and preventing persons from leaving the flagged area. These are known as preventative actions and for the season over 150 actions were taken by members to prevent rescues from occurring.

There were some occasions that members went beyond the call of duty. Patrol 1's Craig Vickers was quick to establish if persons were indeed in need of rescue, Patrol 2's Pete Lloyd rescued a boat motor from its watery grave on the break wall. Patrol 3 made sure they were ready for a high speed rescue by having the thunder-cat on the beach and Patrol 4's Heath Balkin just choose the best place to place the flags so Heath and his patrol could sit back and enjoy the sun.

As a club we should be proud of achieving a major rescue free summer and continue to improve our skills so as to establish the foundations for another strong summer. In addition the constant improving of rescue equipment will support members in the core operations of preventing loss of life in the beach environment.

Thanks and Appreciation

The club continues to survive as a volunteer organization through support from the community. Financially the club looks healthy with various grant monies being held for major expenditure planned over the next 2 to 3 years. These improvements will see the club have a major facelift so as to improve the services and attract members back to the club.

In the meantime though, local businesses help the club to be financially viable. The North Haven Bowling and Recreation Club has continued to show its dedication to the community by supporting the purchase of an Inflatable Rescue Boat and Motor in 2003. This allows the club to continue to function efficiently and effectively. There support with providing facilities for the Melbourne Cup Day Fundraising day should also be noted and warm thanks be given to the club and its management.

Members provide their time to patrolling duties for usually 7 hours per day. The club decided on previous seasons that the provision of lunch would be made to members. The expense of this has been towed by two local businesses. Mike Carney Meats and Cookes Bakery both located in the main street of Laurieton donate the ingredients for a BBQ lunch every Sunday and Public Holiday. The amount of food is enough for 5-8 people and encourages members to participate and attend patrols. All members are thankful for their contributions and this has kept patrolling members alert and ready for all situations.

The club thanks its sponsors and values their support, now and in the future.

The club is also at debt to the President Peter Lloyd and Chief Examiner John Vipond. There continued effort in directing the club over the last twelve months also should be noted and thanked for putting the club before themselves on many occasions where the club takes up personal time with various meetings and commitments.

Patrol Attendance Record:

Due to the dwindling number of members, the remaining have had to take up the brunt of the hours on patrol. In previous seasons there have a few members who have spent in excess of 100 hours per season on the beach.


