Surf Life Saving Mid North Coast Branch President's Report 2008/09

The 2008/09 season was a notable one for the Mid North Coast Branch for a number of memorable events which were highly successful.

Newcastle Permanent Building Society was again the Branch's major sponsor and without them it is doubtful that we would be able to run many of our programmes. These include:

- The Junior Development Camp
- The Age Managers Course
- The Officials Course and uniforms
- Assessor uniforms
- The Annual Awards Night
- The Junior Life Saver of the Year
- Branch Championships and medals
- Carnival Presentations

Last season it was reported that the Branch had obtained a RWC (Rescue Water Craft) and had a small but enthusiastic group in training. The Perm through the Newcastle Permanent Building Society Charitable Foundation made a special grant to the Branch which the Branch was able to use towards the provision of this item of equipment. Fuel was sponsored by the Mobil Garage at Tacking Point. At this stage of time this is generous support. The Branch has also able to obtain another RWC to cover the northern part of the Branch sponsored by Port Macquarie and Kempsey Local Phone Directory. The numbers involved in the operation of the RWC have increased dramatically and so that is now a total of 12. It is very encouraging at the moment

The Patrol competition was funded using the Branch own funds. This enabled the purchase of equipment for the winners and placegetters as well as a presentation on some equipment to every club in the Branch. The competition was won by Macksville Scotts Head with Tacking Point in second place and Port Macquarie third

Telstra again conducted the "Heroes of the Surf" campaign which was even more successful than last year and raised almost \$8,000 for the clubs for rescue equipment. This money is distributed to the clubs and it is understood that the programme will be run again this year.

Patrol uniforms and financial support was also provided by DHL. Settlement City again sponsored the Settlement City Challenge which promises to be bigger and better again next year.

The NSW government provided a grant towards the upgrading of the Camden Haven Club house.

The Federal Labour Government has granted Wauchope Bonny Hills SLSL C \$2.7 M towards the cost of a new clubhouse. Port Macquarie Hastings Council provided increased support to the clubs in their area and both Kempsey and Nambucca Shire Councils continued their assistance.

NSW has continued its grant from the Government through SLSNSW without which we could not operate. SLSNSW has given \$6337 to each club and entity from its fundraising activities to assist with their fundraising.

Probably the most outstanding achievement for the year was the selection Ryan Rosenbaum from Tacking Point as highly commended as NSW Life Saver of the Year.

Aaron Burton and Sarah Rayner were the Young Citizens of the year for Nambucca Shire and Port Macquarie Hastings Council areas respectively. Also this year Sarah was awarded an "Order of Australian Medal and Commendation for Community Service" by the NSW Governor at Government House.

Dane Rickwood won the Jason Northy Memorial Ironman Event.

The Branch was represented at the State by Sam Filetti and Amber Carew as the Junior Male and Female Life Savers of the Year. The other nominations were Anthony Thompson and Rachael Perkins from MSH, Joe Compton and Caitlyn Prior from TP and Mitch Holterman and Laura Nixon from WBH.

We must congratulate our two MNC Branch team members that gained representative honours in the NSW Country Team to tour New Zealand and they were Bayden Purnel from Port Macquarie SLSC and Ashley Holden from Macksville Scotts Head SLSC.

Some of the most pleasing achievements at the State and Australian Titles were gained by Ned Sanchez who won Gold and Silver and Fiona Casey who won gold at Aussies and both from the South West Rocks Club. Other competitors that performed well were Fred Middleton, Gary Smith and Rob Hiatt (Port Macquarie Masters) and the Macksville Scotts Head 240 years Boat Crew at the State.

The Executive consisted of "Vice President" Rod McDonagh, "Director of Administration" Ken Wilson, "Director of Finance" Don Mackenzie, "Registrar" Bruce Caldwell, "Director of Life Saving Paul Rayner and Director of Education Kim Rayner. As there was no elected Director of Competition and Coaching" for the past season, Chalkie Bob Smith took control of the refereeing of all our local Branch Carnivals. We as a Branch are happy to see that Chalkie Bob has put up his hand and accepted this position for the ensuing season. Our Junior Activities Chairperson, Peter Lambert performed extremely well at both an Executive level and as the Inter-branch Team Manager

Rod in particular was of invaluable assistance and I cannot thank him enough for his efforts. Rod also represented the Branch on the State Council due to my position as Director of Finance disqualifying me from that role.

A big thank you must go to our SLS NSW Development Officer Andrew Jones for his massive support and time to our Branch and availing himself at our Branch Council Meetings and the taking of the minutes.

Paul Rayner took over as Director of Life Saving and did an excellent job in a difficult portfolio. He was ably assisted by Ryan Rosenbaum in his capacity as the Branch Support Officer

In the education field the Branch was more that well serviced by Kim Rayner, Kerrie Fisher and Sue Croad. The Branch is probably better serviced than most other Branches within NSW Branches.

Kim Rayner got through a huge volume of work in her administrative role as the Director of Education which saw a high number of SLS courses run by our Branch which benefited all our eight clubs.. One cannot stress enough just how much work Paul and Kim Rayner do for the Branch.

Don Mackenzie again looked after our financial affairs with his usual flair and Ken Wilson kept an eye on the Branches Administrative matters. Bruce Caldwell did his usual sterling job as Registrar our records are superb. Peter Lambert managed the affairs of the Juniors after reluctantly accepting the role part way through the season.

Tacking Point was again host to the Country Championships with 1800 competitors competing and aided by the support of Stramit Building Supplies and Port Macquarie Hasting Council. Once again the event

proved to be a huge success and the largest NSW Country Titles ever. The club deserves every accolade it received for their effort. Next season we will see the NSW Country Titles move to South West Rocks. Good luck.

The Branch Championships were finally held at Flynns Beach on the last day of the season and after three attempts at holding them due to the prevailing weather conditions at Wauchope Bonny Hills had proved unsuccessful. The senior champions were Port Macquarie. The junior championships were all earlier won by Tacking Point at Wauchope Bonny Hills.

Some of the Award winners for the 2008/2009 season were, "Rookie of the Year" Rebecca Locksley from Port Macquarie, "Young Life Saver" Aaron Burton from Macksville Scotts Head, "Administrator of the Year" Jan Clingeleffer, "Competition Official of the Year" Bruce Caldwell, "Training Officer" and "Lifesaver of the Year" was Chris Stewart.

This Branch has an enormous depth of talent in Competition, Life Saving and could achieve all sorts of results if there is sufficient commitment. I am very pleased with what we have already achieved in the Education area especially after my initial misgiving. Life Saving as a core area and of a high standard needs constant continuous improvement.

The Inter-branch Team was coached by Jeff Polverino and managed by Peter Lambert and ably assisted by Dave Rickwood, Maz Rickwood and Jess Lambert. They performed themselves creditably at Katherine Hill Bay.

There will be some changes next year with our sponsorship and there will also be some major changes with the structure of SLS NSW now that they are a Company.

I am confident, however, as we enter our eightieth year that these matters can be overcome and that we will have another bumper year.

Director of Life Saving Annual Report 2009

During this season, the Lifesaving and Education Portfolio was split into two separate portfolios with Kim Rayner becoming the first Director of Education in the Mid North Coast Branch.

This allowed me to concentrate wholly on the job of Lifesaving and in general the patrolling of our beaches. Under the Lifesaving Portfolio, our Support Operations Group continued to expand with the commissioning of our second Rescue Water Craft (RWC) being stationed and patrolling from South West Rocks. The addition of five new members to group together with the four existing members bolstered our ranks to nine members, who patrolled on the RWC together with doing their normal rostered hours on the beach for their clubs. We are in the process of training a further seven operators in the hope that these members will give of their time to the group.

The duty officer system was established in the Branch with a number of call-outs through the season. I would like to thank Ryan Rosenbaum, Mike Stevenson and Rod McDonagh for assisting me with this.

As we experienced a very high volume of visitors to the area over the past season in part due to tourists not travelling overseas, our beaches were frequented by large numbers through the surf season. This increase in numbers placed a lot of pressure on our volunteer surf lifesavers and to each and every one of you that patrolled through the season; I personally would like to thank you for your time and effort.

The increase in numbers also produced an increase in the risk to surfers and swimmers, and it is with sadness that I report that we had two drowning in the Branch during the season. The first on Australia Day at Little Bay South West Rocks, the second on 8 April at Rainbow Beach Bonny Hills. These two drownings were both during times when there were no surf lifesavers on the beach. My thoughts are with the families that lost their love ones on these days.

The patrol competition was conducted again through the season and a special thanks to Newcastle Permanent Building Society for sponsoring this event. The results of this competition were

1st Place - Macksville Scotts Head

2nd Place – Tacking Point

3rd Place – Port Macquarie

Congratulations of these results. It was pleasing to see the standard of the patrolling groups on the beach this season and the professionalism when members are attired in their full patrol uniform. The standard shown through the scenario components of the inspections was extremely good and it goes to show that the standard of patrolling member that is being produced through our education arm is first class,

Some Patrol stats for this season:

Our eight surf lifesaving clubs patrolled for 25,643.5 hours during the season.

Our top patrolling male member for the Branch was Chris Stewart from Macksville Scotts Head with 258.5 hours. Chris was also the male Surf Lifesaver of the Year. Congratulations Chris, a great effort. Our leading female patrolling member was Linda Cooper from South West Rocks with 185 hours. Congratulations Linda, another great effort. Both these members are patrol captains at their respective clubs and it is great to see them leading by example.

Our surf lifesaving clubs made 294 rescues during the season. We had 211,116 visitors to our beaches, we assisted in 318 First Aid Cases, with 9 requiring Ambulance assistance, we made 8873 preventative actions and we had 37 beach closures during the season due to heavy sea conditions. A great effort from all clubs. I am glad to say that there were no swimming fatalities between the flags.

A big congratulation should go to Wauchope Bonny Hills SLSC on their being granted \$2.7 million for the building of their new surf club. I am sure that it will be of great benefit to all club members when it is completed. I would like to encourage all members at the club to stick with the club for the coming season. I know it will be hard to operate out of containers, but the wait will be worth it.

I hope that next season will be as enjoyable as this season was for me. I have again taken on the role of Director of Lifesaving and look forward to seeing you on the beach. Thank you all for your time and commitment.

Director of Education Report

Education started off this season as part of Lifesaving until the split in August, 2008. Since then we have held monthly meetings and I would like to thank all the members whom have turned up to our Education Meetings. I would also like to thank Kerry Fisher and Sue Croad my Education Officers in the North. They have done an extremely good job this year.

As can be seen from the table below we have had 295 assessment requests and 2380 proficiencies this season, a huge effort from all concerned.

Our Trainers have contributed in excess of 4190 hours, Assessors have contributed in excess of 408 hours for awards and 258 hours for proficiencies and Facilitators have contributed in excess of 256 hours.

We trialled one proficiency day per club this season, from all feedback it was well received and the trial was very successful with clubs embracing the idea and getting behind the concept. An example was MSH club had 95% of its members turn up for their proficiency day, well done to all clubs for embracing this idea.

This year has seen some changes in regard to courses including IRB Driver and Crew and a combined Advanced Resuscitation & Defibrillation Certificate, although the ARC and Defib can still be run separately.

Next season will see the full Certificate III in Public Safety (Aquatic Search & Rescue) being introduced, the Senior First Aid Certificate will now come under the Health Package with minor changes and also the Penthrox (green whistle) Pain Management will be introduced.

We have been audited this season for our ongoing improvements as a Registered Training Organisation and received 85%. With some minor changes in paperwork and our inductions at courses, we are now sitting at 98% which is a big effort for our Education Committee. A big thank you.

Currently we have 30 trainers, 28 assessors, and 6 facilitators available in the branch and a thank you for the hard work they have done in meeting the high standard required of a RTO, this team is proactively challenging themselves to improve on how we deliver courses and assessments and will be involved in a mini camp on the 16th August to further continue this progress.

We need new blood in the ranks to help reduce the work load, this is especially prevalent at Kempsey Crescent Head where they do not have any current training officers.

A Branch Education Conference will be run on Sunday 16th August. All trainers and assessors are asked to attend, so that they are kept up to date on Branch policies and protocols for training and assessing, annual re-endorsements, resources and forms. SLSNSW will also launch their Pride in Education Campaign at this conference.

Branch courses will be conducted as a result of a Training Needs Analysis. Clubs may also like to follow this lead and target specific courses and individuals according to the needs of patrols and the club.

IRBD upgrades are in progress to add the two nationally recognised units of competency to members awards. If you completed your Silver Medallion IRBD award prior to November 2007 there is now an upgrade process in place, similar to the Cert. II in Public Safety (Aquatic Rescue) upgrade. This is not compulsory, but is aimed at IRB trainers and assessors and others who my wish to upgrade.

New resources due for release in 2009-2010 season - Pain Management, Cert III in Public Safety (Aquatic Search and Rescue), 7th edition Powercraft Manual, 33rd edition Training Manual, ATV.

SLSNSW will have an audit by VETAB early next year. As part of this audit VETAB may wish to audit individual Branches or Clubs. So please make sure that all your training and assessing processes are in place and followed. We don't want to be responsible for a poor result

A huge thank you to everyone for their assistance and support in this my first Season in the role of Director of Education.

Registrar's Report 2008/2009

Well another season has passed by, and what a busy one it was for Club Training Officer's and Branch Assessors with three thousand five hundred and sixty six awards, proficiencies and JAC awards being completed. This figure also includes Junior Participation and Competition skills evaluations. There was one Junior club did not registrar any Participation and Competition evaluations. These proficiencies must be registered in surfguard before JAC members are allowed to compete in Sunday club events and also compete in surf carnivals.

Before the season commenced, a proficiency night was held at the girl guides hall in Port Macquarie for Assessors to upgrade their skills and become proficient for the awards that they held. The night was most successful with most Assessors attending this night and becoming proficient. For the coming season of 2009/2010, two nights are planned to be in August, one in the north of the Branch and one in the south of the Branch. It is hoped that all Assessors will be attend either of these nights to complete their proficiencies for their awards and be ready to commence the new season.

The number of awards are up from the previous season with seven hundred and eleven awards being gained by members of Mid North Coast Branch Clubs. Well done to the club education and training officers for this increase in awards. Unfortunately there were two clubs that did not increase their awards, but I am sure that these two clubs will look at their awards and work very hard to increase them.

The past season, saw all eight Branch clubs hold a proficiency day. This is the first time that all clubs have successfully completed their proficiencies on the one day. Practically all club members completed proficiencies for all of their awards. One thousand two hundred and sixty seven proficiencies were completed on these days., which was an increase of two hundred and seventy eight proficiencies. A couple of the southern clubs were a bit apprehensive about trying this concept, but as figures show, the days were a great success and they also allow for greater use of assessors time and resources.

Once again there was quite a large number of transfers from Branch clubs coming and going between clubs from inside and outside of the Branch during the season. The number of transfers entered into surfguard was one hundred and ninety.

I would like to offer my thanks to the Branch executive for their help during the season and also to Lisa Jones, State Awards Co-ordinator, for processing and returning awards in time for club presentation nights.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE MEMBER OF MID NORTH COAST SURF LIFE SAVING INC

Report on the Financial Report

We have audited the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose financial report, of Mid North Coast Surf Life Saving Inc (the association) which comprises the balance sheet as at 31 May 2009 and the income statement, statement of recognised income and expense for the year ended on that date, a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory notes and the statement by members of the committee.

Committee's Responsibility for the Financial Report

The committee of the association is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report and have determined that the accounting policies described in Note 1 to the financial statements, which form part of the financial report, are consistent with the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporations Act 1984 New South Wales and are appropriate to meet the needs of the members. The committee's responsibility also includes establishing and maintaining internal controls relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report that is free of material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error; selecting and applying appropriate accounting policies; and making accounting estimates that are reasonable in the circumstances.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the financial report based on our audit. No opinion is expressed as to whether the accounting policies used, as described in Note 1, are appropriate to meet the needs of the members. We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. These Auditing Standards require that we comply with relevant ethical requirements relating to audit engagements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial report is free of material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial report. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks or material misstatement of the financial report, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial report in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by the committee, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial report.

Another senior member, Craig Vickers stood up this year and provided invaluable leadership assistance to his patrol.

Our clubhouse has been used extensively throughout the season. The premises was used for seminars by the local and state government, the NSW Department of Education, the NSW police for training and education purposes, local sporting groups for training purposes and to the general public for weddings and special functions. Our club house has been a valuable resource to the local Camden Haven Community.

Our nippers were small in number and have continued to struggle this year. This is an area that we must continue to nurture and develop.

Our profile in the local community remains high. We have, and value, a very positive image in the Camden Haven community.

Patrol Statistics

The use of the half day patrols continues to be embraced enthusiastically by all of those who volunteer their valuable time. We retained our 6 patrols and attempted to develop the depth and talent within each patrol. Social activity was encouraged with communal BBQ lunches being popular for changeover AM/PM patrols. Our Patrol Captains increased their skill level during the off season with nine of our members obtaining their Silver Medallion Basic Beach Management Certificate.

14 of our members have patrolled over 46 hours, with one enthusiast breaking the 110 hour mark. Our small club completed over 1860 hours of patrolling this summer.

No major rescues were recorded for the season.

Beach and surf conditions were quite favourable over the summer period with only the occasional rough and extremely dangerous situations occurring. Beach numbers appear to be up this summer. This could be attributed to the favourable weather conditions and the current restrictive economic climate. Our patrols have been successful in limiting rescue situations by being diligent and vigilant in their patrolling duties. Over 200 preventative actions were made over the season and that has certainly contributed to keeping the beach safe for all.

Our Surf Club was again heavily involved with this local event centering on the beautiful Pilot Beach and the Dunbogan area. The Camden Haven Surf club provided water safety and support for the junior competitors and open water swim on the Saturday and the senior triathlon on the Sunday morning.

Club members provided water safety for the Port Macquarie Iron Man Triathlon while other members coordinated an Aid Station for the cycle leg of this amazing international event.

The Camden Have Surf Club members provided support and guidance in lifesaving activities to local schools throughout the season. This involvement included instruction in lifesaving skills, use of equipment, public awareness of Surf Lifesaving and the professional development of teaching staff.

We hosted several Mid North Coast Branch courses during this year including an IRB Driver & Crewman's Course and the Silver Medallion Basic Beach Management Course.
