EVENTS AND COMPETITION:

The 2011/12 season was not kind for Surf Life Saving Competition this year as both the MNC Junior and MNC Open Branch Championships had to be rescheduled a couple of times due to bad weather and large seas.

Eventually, the MNC Branch Carnivals were a go at Tacking Point Beach but had a restricted number of Events due to the conditions.

Results can be viewed elsewhere in the Report, both within the Age Champions Section and the MNC Branch Championships Results. Congratulations to all those who competed and the Final Age Champions. And where would these Carnivals be without the Members working in the back ground, whether it be the Officials, Recorders, Water Safety, Runners and of course the Host Clubs. A big thank you to all those involved.

Another highly successful Carnival was the NSW Country Titles at South West Rocks. This is the 3rd time the South West Rocks Club has run this gigantic Event and it is a Credit to all their Members as I am sure that President Rod would make some mention of this in his Report. With this Carnival attracting 50 NSW Clubs and approximately 2000 competitors from Country Surf Clubs over a 3 day period. To make the Carnival a further success there were approximately 150 Officials working on the beach. No wonder this Event was again recognised from the Branch as the MNC Branch "Event of the Year."

Many of our Clubs had successes at State and Australian with Wauchope Bonny Hills, Tacking Point and Macksville Scotts Head SLSC's bringing home National Medals in Surf Boats.

Tacking Point SLSC faired extremely well at State with their Juniors and the dedication of their Chief Coach in Dave Rickwood who had his Team pushing out at least 10 Training sessions each week. Well done Dave.

Port Macquarie SLSC competed well in the Masters in Both State and Aussies. Mr Surf, Larry Brook winning a State O/60's Swim and then backing up for the Aussies and gaining 1st Place in the O/60's Tube Race. Other credible Port Macquarie Results were:



DIRECTOR OF LIFESAVING

Another Surf Life Saving season has passed with our eight clubs providing a priceless service to the communities of the Mid North Coast.

The Mid North Coast Support Operations Group continued its good work with 4 new members being trained in the use of this craft. The total operators has now reached 15 with a member that has offered his services through the school holidays when he returns form University.

We will be taking delivery of a new SeaDoo GTS130 to replace the aging ski in the north of the branch. The Yamaha that has been in service for the past three years has provided excellent service and alas is due to be retired. The continued support of our Major Fuel Sponsor BP Lighthouse Plaza has lightened the costly burden of fuelling the ski in the South for operation purposes. To David and Julie, I thank you for your continued support with this venture.

The duty officer system across New South Wales has been a huge success. The six duty officers in this area have been called out on at least 20 occasions this season and have always answered the call. I thank all of you for your time and effort that you put into the emergency services roles within this branch. I would like to congratulate Ryan Rosenbaum for being selected to attend the State Duty Officer training weekend in July. Ryan has been shortlisted to attend this weekend from a number of persons who applied for the position across the state. I wish you all the best in your endeavours.

Whilst on duty officers and support operations, a regional workshop for duty officers has been discussed and hopefully in the not too distant future one will be held in this area.

A number of call-outs through the season kept the Emergency Call-Out teams active. Of significance were the two drowning fatalities in the Port Macquarie area where two people on separate occasions died whilst attempting to save their dogs. A tragic outcome on these two occasions. A third fatality at South West Rocks late in the season saw a man perish in large seas at Main Beach. Call out teams were also called to assist in the search of a missing yachtsman who is presumed to have fallen overboard in the Hastings River. To the members who assisted in the search for two day and gave up their time, a big thank you.

Overall across the state, the drowning fatalities increased rather drastically this year with approximately 42 drowning deaths compared to 22 last year. This spike was mainly due to unseasonal hot weather in February and March across the state. I believe that the strengthening of the support operations network now which includes all branches is working to minimise the gaps that we have in patrolling techniques. Without these and the patrols that provide safe aquatic areas at our beaches, the toll would have been significantly higher with about

Congratulations on these results. It was pleasing to see the standard

of the patrolling groups on the beach this season and the professionalism when members are attired in their full when members are attired in their full patrol uniform.

Our eight surf lifesaving clubs patrolled 26,000 hours this season and performed 13,000 plus preventative actions together with over 200 Rescues.

There are some changes afoot with communications within this Branch and we hope to assist clubs with this transition. The SLS NSW Club Conference is on again this year and all clubs should avail themselves the three places that they are offering so as to keep up with trends and innovations at this level.

We need to stay vigilant in the off season and keep our equipment to a standard where we can respond to incidents as they arise.




To the club captains, well done. I thank you for your assistance throughout the season. Keep up the good work and I look forward to working with you in the future.

DIECTOR OF EDUCATION

Firstly I would like to thank the Branch Education Committee for their dedication and enthusiasm throughout the season. I would also like to thank the Branch Education Officers, Anne & Chris for their support. We have a great committee that works tirelessly to keep education on their toes and moving in the right direction. A huge thank you to Judy Spicer, SLSNSW Academy Support Officer for her guidance, advice and continuous support.



As can be seen from the table below we have had 220 candidates obtain their Kim Rayner
Bronze Medallion and Surf Rescue Certificates, 30 IRB Crew, 10 IRB Driver, numerous other awards, and 2438 proficiencies this season, a huge effort from all concerned.

Our Trainers have contributed in excess of 2500 hours, Assessors have contributed in excess of 200 hours for awards, 400 hours for proficiencies and Facilitators have contributed in excess of 260 hours.

Currently we have 39 trainers, 25 assessors, and 9 facilitators with 9 probationary trainers and 4 probationary assessors available in the branch and a thank you for the hard work they have done in meeting the high standard required of a RTO, this team is proactively challenging themselves to improve on how we deliver courses and assessments.

New resources due for release in 2012-2013 season – Advanced First Aid trial continuing, Trainer and Assessor Units for Training and Education, Silver Medallion Aquatic Rescue, and Silver Medallion Basic Beach Management has been completely revamped and a lot better course.

REGISTRARS REPORT

Another season has come and gone and it proved to be just as busy as in previous seasons for the Club Training Officers and Assessors, with three thousand nine hundred and seven (3907) Senior awards, proficiencies and JAC awards and proficiencies being carried out, a decrease of twenty four (24) from the previous season. This figure also included twenty three (23) Junior Activities Preliminary Evaluations from Camden Haven SLSC which is great to see.

This season, senior awards were down by seventy nine (79) from the previous season, with a total of seven hundred and eight four (784) awards gained by new and existing members from the eight clubs in the Mid North Coast Branch.

This is still a great effort by the Training Officers from all of the clubs. However, more training needs to be carried out in the area of the IRB awards. The number of these awards is decreasing with five clubs failing to gain any Silver Medallion IRB Driver awards. This area of the awards needs to be looked at for the coming season. Also Spinal Management awards have decreased.

Junior Surf education awards have increased by thirty (30) from the previous season, with eight hundred and ninety (890) certificates being awarded to JAC members. This is a great effort considering that Camden Haven SLSC is in the process of rebuilding their Junior section of the club. Two other clubs did not put some of their JAC members in for their Surf Play 1 and 2 awards, which would have increased the numbers greatly.

Branch run proficiency days were again held during the first couple of months of the season. Practically all club members completed proficiencies for all of their awards at these days. One thousand and forty seven (1047) proficiencies were completed on these days, which was an increase of eighty four (84) proficiencies from the previous season.

During the season two hundred and sixty nine (269) transfers were completed by Branch clubs.

Once again I strongly recommend that no award courses be run during the months of April and May by clubs and Branch to allow all clubs to process their awards and finalise their annual reports and more importantly have their awards back from Surf Life Saving New South Wales in time for their Annual Presentation nights. Once again I would like to offer my thanks to the Branch executive for their help during the season and also to Lisa Jones, the former Surf Life Saving New South Wales Awards coordinator, for processing and returning awards in time for club presentation nights. Lisa will be sorely missed by one and all on a job well done.



Treasurers Report 2011/2012

The 2011/2012 season has been another strong and successful year for the boat series financially.

Our much valued major sponsor The Hoey Moey again supported the series, along with Lion Nathan, Reilly & Sons, Arc Attack, Boambee Industrial Supply Co (Bisco), and Vertigo Blue. The continued support of all enabled the series to continue the increased prize money for all divisions as well as increase the value and quality of prizes.

In kind sponsorship from Arc Attack's modifications to the gear trailer, Bisco supplying chain for the buoys as well as shirts for the officials, and Vertigo Blue providing swimwear and apparel to the ladies crews, all of which have assisted the boat series to be more professional and self sufficient on the beach.

Last season at the AGM it was agreed to increase the entry fees. Despite the absence of a couple of regular clubs this season, the series had 43 crews enter for the season in comparison to last season's 41 crews, however casual entries were significantly reduced to approx one-fifth from last season's numbers. The series received a total of \$9,650 in entries, an increase of nearly \$1,800 from the last two seasons.

The presentation at the Hoey Moey was another success with everyone enjoying dressing up and then kicking up their heels. Financially on the cost of meals the series was able to look after our much loved officials, our sponsors and also our life members and come out of it a total \$18 in front. The committee's aim is not to make money from the evening, just to cover costs and look after everyone.

The major purchase for the series this season was a second set of buoys for \$6,600, enabling the course to be set with both gate and turning buoys. For the season's financials the series netted \$5,159 income, adding in the purchase of the set of buoys on top of this, the series netted a loss of \$1,441 for 2011/2012.

With the continued support of all our sponsors and the profile of the sport and the series continually being lifted, we are looking forward to another successful season in 2012/2013.

On a personal note, at the end of my fifth season as treasurer, I would like to thank all the committee members who have been involved in that time in continuing to improve the series, maintaining good sportsmanship, and all being like-minded in keeping the sport and the series as the priority. I am honoured to be part of it and to receive the camaraderie you all provide.






On the competition front, I'm proud to say we competed well at all the Carnivals we went to. From the Nipper Carnivals, to Branch, to State, & the




